## Bishop Stowe on "Synod & Eucharistic Revival"

We have an exciting opportunity coming up at St Agnes! Bishop John Stowe of Lexington who visited us last year will be coming again. Mark your calendars for the evening of May 2 and the morning of May 3. Bishop John will be giving a talk on the theme the "Synod and Eucharistic Revival." More details will be given soon. On April 30<sup>th</sup> our young people will be making their First Communion, so right afterwards is a perfect time to have Bishop John visit. The talk will be based upon the Pope's Apostolic letter Desiderio Desideravi (on the Liturgical formation of the people of God). You might consider reading this powerful reflection before his talk. This can be found on the Vatican Web page. The Eucharist, as Vatican II reminds us, is the Source and Summit of our faith. This means the work of the synod flows out of our Eucharistic Celebration, and the themes of the synod—communion, participation, and mission. The liturgy empowers us to embody and be a synodal people.

#### Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter! We enter a celebration that starts Easter Sunday and continues until Pentecost. We are in a season of Mystoqoqia where our newest members who have received Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion unpack what these sacraments mean. It will take a lifetime to unpack these mysteries. They start from their experience of the Risen Lord! I am reminded of Benicio, who was baptized at the Easter Vigil, and when he came out after Baptism and had put on his baptismal garment. I asked him what he saw, and he said new life! The next day I asked him again, "Benicio, how would you describe last night?" "Well," he said, "it was like a puzzle, and I found the missing piece." This reminded me of something Peter said as he preached in the Acts of the Apostles. He said the stone that was rejected had become the cornerstone. This is what Benicio is telling us. Jesus was the missing piece for him, and, now that he has found it, he can see the whole puzzle. As our newest members who have experienced the Easter Mysteries for the first time, we need to listen to all of them and their stories—Benicio, Zoe, Steve, Bo, Kim, and Jim. They should renew us to experience the sacraments with open eyes and open hearts so that we can experience them in a fresh way through the Risen Lord and be empowered by the Holy Spirit to carry out his mission. We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our Song!
