# Bishop Stowe on "Synod & Eucharistic Revival"

We have an exciting opportunity coming up at St Agnes! Bishop John Stowe of Lexington who visited us last year will be coming again. Mark your calendars for the evening of May 2 at 7pm and the morning of May 3 at 10am. Bishop John will be giving a talk on the theme the "Synod and Eucharistic Revival." More details will be given soon. On April 30<sup>th</sup> our young people will be making their First Communion, so right afterwards is a perfect time to have Bishop John visit. The talk will be based upon the Pope's Apostolic letter Desiderio Desideravi (on the Liturgical formation of the people of God). You might consider reading this powerful reflection before his talk. This can be found on the Vatican Web page. The Eucharist, as Vatican II reminds us, is the Source and Summit of our faith. This means the work of the synod flows out of our Eucharistic Celebration, and the themes of the synod communion, participation, and mission. The liturgy empowers us to embody and be a synodal people.

All are welcome to participate in this intergenerational faith community event. CFF will not meet at 9:15 on May 7<sup>th</sup> but will be meeting at 11:35 instead.

Dear Parishioners,

As you may be aware, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have called for a Eucharistic Revival. There was some discussion among the small group leadership here at St Agnes on how we follow up from the synod and the small groups that we did during Lent. The theme that seemed to emerge is the connection between the Eucharist and Synodality. This, I believe, is the gift of the Holy Spirit among the faithful people of God. After some discussion, we thought maybe we should invite Bishop John Stowe because he kicked off our parish renewal on synodality. I was surprised when Bishop Stowe told me through email that he planned to begin to study this theme using Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter Desiderio Desideravi, on the Liturgical formation of the people of God (https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/ apost letters/documents/20220629-lettera-apdesiderio-desideravi.html). I found it another indicator of the Holy Spirit at work that Bishop John Stowe and St Agnes were moving in the same direction.

I bring this up because this week's gospel perhaps is a way for us to make the connection between Synodality and the Eucharist. The first emphasis is the two disciples on a journey and the risen Lord who is present among them. Our earliest understanding of Eucharist is a pilgrim people on a journey. This is synodality. Then notice how the Risen Lord is made present to them through accompanying them on the journey and listening. What did Jesus listen to? Jesus listened to their hurts and griefs. This has been part of Pope Francis' call, that we listen to the periphery those who have been hurt by the church. Notice how Jesus comes among them as the stranger. Who is the stranger that we have excluded from the community or the meal? They journey with us; the Risen Lord is present in them. Notice what happens in the story: the disciples are changed by their encounter with the Risen Lord. This, again, is the call of the synod; through journeying together, listening, and dialogue that the Risen Lord comes among us to transform us. As Pope Francis emphasized, if we have truly practiced synodality, we come out different from that dialogue. As disciples we

begin to see our story connected to the larger story we find in sacred scriptures and the presence of the Risen Jesus. A very important point in this gospel, how did they become aware of Jesus presence? "The breaking of the Bread." This is an important point, that the Eucharist is not static but synodality is necessary for Eucharistic revival. The breaking of bread means that the presence of the Lord that we celebrate around the table is made present through sharing life with one another, and journeying together. It is not a passive thing.

I would suggest in the last year that St Agnes has done many things to celebrate synodality and its connection with the Eucharist. Small groups sharing faith and life with each other, ecumenical prayer services working towards greater communion with the bigger body of Christ, our First Communion children and their families making a homeless meal together (they will also share a meal together before their First Communion), feet washing parishioner to parishioner on Holy Thursday, welcoming our newest members into the church at the Easter Vigil, celebrating First Communion soon, and having Bishop John Stowe talk on Eucharist and Synodality. And this is just to name a few. These are all ways that St Agnes has celebrated Synodality and Eucharistic revival. We should be like the disciples in Emmaus who see in the meal itself the mission, and what did they say? "Stay with us Lord." The church teaches that Eucharist is source and summit of our lives. If we break bread and open our lives together, it sends us forth. The Lord stays with us on our mission in the family, coaching a little league game, the ICU unit, the school, and the work for justice on the public square, etc. As we celebrate Eucharist, let's remember that we are called to journey together, listen to one another, see our story connected to the Jesus story, share our lives along with the presence of the Risen Lord present in breaking of Bread. Recognizing that the Lord stays with us throughout the week to carry out the mission. This, I believe, is the call of Synodality and Eucharistic revival.







# The Gospel at Home

#### This Week's Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

This Sunday's Gospel tells the classic story of the presence of the Risen Jesus in the lives of his followers. Two discouraged disciples walk home to Emmaus after Jesus' Death in Jerusalem. A stranger falls in step and helps them see that the Messiah was not to be a triumphant king, but a suffering servant. At supper they recognize the stranger as Jesus in the breaking of the bread. At Mass we listen to the Scripture and we recognize the Risen Christ in the community and in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread.

#### Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): The story of the Risen Jesus meeting two followers on the road is full of details your child will remember. Help your child understand that every time you go to Mass you recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread.


Promise (Grades K-1): This week's lesson helped your child understand how Jesus is with us today at Mass—in the Eucharist, in the priest, in the people who come together to celebrate the breaking of the bread, and in the Word of God. Share with your child how important Sunday Mass is to you. Ask your child to show and tell about the happy heart medallion he or she made in class.

Good News (Grades 2–3): Your child learned the importance of making loving choices. Ask your child to tell the family the story of Paul and how he changed. In your own words, tell the Gospel story of Jesus and the two disciples at Emmaus and talk about how you all recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread at Mass every Sunday. Talk about what is meant by the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Venture (Grades 4–6): The class focused on the story of Jesus and his disciples on the road to Emmaus, and discussed how we can recognize Jesus in our midst. Allow your child to have an opportunity to tell you about his or her own Emmaus Walk, and to share what was learned about the different characters met along the journey. Ask your young person to tell you about how our faith practices and traditions are similar to the disciples' in the Gospel.

Visions (Grades 7–9): When the two disciples in the Gospel story walk with Jesus to Emmaus, they began to understand why Jesus had to suffer. They also recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. Make a list of questions each of you would want to ask Jesus if you had the chance to take a long walk with him. Share the questions with one another. Talk, too, about ways you can make Mass a more important part of your life. Your family may want to go to weekday Mass during the Easter season. Talk, too, about Saint Paul's missionary travels from the week's lesson, including the map provided to see where the locations are.

#### Pray Together

Each day this week, pray the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be together. These three prayers weave together many of the great mysteries of the Easter feast.



Then pray this prayer:

Thank you, God, for the color green. Amen.

Kim is a professor at San Francisco University with a Ph.D. in Religious Studies, who moved here to tend to the needs of her parents. She has an extensive background in African American religion and literature, has been widely published, and has an impressive list of friends and contacts with people involved in racial justice issues. Also we are adding a new book to our Racial Justice Library, Sisters in the Wilderness, by Delores S. Williams. The book, first published in 1993, is widely acknowledged as a groundbreaking classic in womanist theology. The biblical figure of Hagar, slave of Abraham's wife Sarah, becomes a prototype for the struggles of African-American women from their arrival here as slaves till their present day challenges. The story of Hagar's encounter with God in the midst of her slavery, ethnicity, poverty, sexual exploitation and exile in the desert, sheds revelatory light on the spiritual journey of every African-American woman. Well worth a read.


