Dear Parishioners,

I want to begin by thanking folks for all the gifts and goodies they sent this Christmas. I am truly blessed to be a part of the St Agnes family. I heard a reflection this week sharing about what it was like growing up in the Netherlands during World War II with the Nazis. The insight was from the person's experience. The churches were the freest place that one could go. This was a place of refuge to breathe freely without the oppression of the Nazis. I thought of it as an image for the Christmas story as the shepherds went to the cave with Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus. I wonder at that crib, under the oppression of the Roman Empire, if it was the place where those on the lowest place on the totem pole in society felt the freest. I began to think with Pope Francis and his image of enlarging the space of our tent, what if our space was the place people felt most free to be themselves to share their questions and struggles and to experience joy and love. As we celebrate Christmas, let's recognize how the incarnation has continued throughout history; that God wants to take on flesh in us, the human race, taking up our joys and sorrows and, like the shepherds, leading us on the journey.

Kolofata Potholder Fundraiser & More!

Celebrate with us! Thanks to all of you, and especially to our seamstress extraordinaire, Regenia Carder, the potholder fundraiser for Kolofata raised nearly \$600 in sales and over \$600 in donations from attendees!

As many of you know, we had received a challenge grant from an anonymous couple who offered a \$1 match up to \$5,000 for every \$2 in new donations (and fundraisers) we received for the Kolofata Girls' Education Project by December 31, 2022. Thanks to this fundraiser and many donations, as of Monday, December 19, 2022 we have raised \$10,000 and will receive the \$5,000 match.

If you haven't donated yet but have been thinking about it, please send donations to St. Agnes Church and on the memo-line write *Kolofata* or donate online on our parish website. Although we met this fundraising challenge, we are still a long way from our crucial long-term goal of having the funds on hand when a girl starts school to guarantee that we can cover her educational expenses for a minimum of three years (middle school, high school or university). In this moment we rejoice and thank all of you who care about these young girls, Muslim and Christian, half a world away whose lives and whose families' lives are changed forever because you are enabling them to receive an education! Thank you.

Join in Renewing, Renaming and Reinvigorating St Agnes' Commitment to Service

Our long-time Social Concerns Chair relocated about the same time Covid struck. Although our meetings came to a halt, many of our members, through creative adaptations, kept ministries alive. Parish nurses gave ongoing advice on covid, one parishioner made "ugly sleeping" bags" at home, parishioners fed the homeless, provided Christmas gift cards for over 200 people in need, bought Haitian coffee to aid Haitian farmers, provided gift cards monthly to Shepherdstown Shares for personal hygiene needs, donated food weekly to JCCM, raised funds to send Kolofata, Cameroon girls to school through potholder sales and donations, started a Zoom racism group, and many more acts of generosity and service too numerous to name. Though many parishioners helped in multiple ways, a good bit of responsibility landed on the shoulders of a few. It is time to renew and reinvigorate these ministries – and perhaps add new ones.

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops refers to its efforts as Justice, Peace and Human Development. The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston just reopened its Justice and Peace Office. To be in tandem with these efforts we are thinking of renaming ourselves either the Justice, Peace and Human Development Committee (JPHD) or the Justice and Peace (J&P) Committee. Please give this some thought.

We need you! We need folks with new energy, new ideas, new interests. We need folks to serve on the coordinating committee and folks to reinvigorate the individual ministries. What would you like to do?

Watch for a meeting date in January. Let's start the new year with a new commitment to justice, peace and human development!

Be Aware of Holiday Gift Card Scams!

Every holiday season brings on an increase in gift card scams. There are dozens of ways gift cards can be used by scammers to steal money.

Among the ways scammers try to get us is through Maliciously Modified Gift Cards in Stores. In this scam, fraudsters steal department store gift cards, learn their secret PIN information, and then replace back onto the shelves to await a victim. When the victim purchases the previously tampered with card and activates it, the fraudster is often able to spend the gift cards value faster than the victim. The fraudster can call the store's gift card line over and over to verify when the gift card is activated and what value is left on the card.

How to prevent? Look for signs of tampering when you buy a gift card. Some people say to pick gift cards from the end of the stack, but that's assuming that the fraudsters will always place the tampered gift cards up front and that the store's staff didn't rearrange them when restocking new gift cards. Know that all the big vendors using gift cards are aware of these scams and many will offer a way for you to protect yourself against this type of scam and some may even reimburse you if you are out money.

Please Don't Fall Victim To Email & Texting Scams!

We continue to hear from far too many parishioners that they are receiving emails or text messages from someone posing as Fr. Andy or Fr. Mat. If you ever receive an email from someone posing as St. Agnes staff asking for money, gift cards, etc., it is a scam.

No one, not Fr Andy nor Fr Mat nor St. Agnes staff, will ever write to you personally asking for 'favors' or to request that you to make a purchase or send money. You can usually tell by looking closely at the email address who sent the message. Emails from St. Agnes always come from <<*email>*>@stagnesshepherdstown.org. Emails from Fr. Andy will be

from aswitzer@stagnesshepherdstown.org or aswitzer@dwc.org. These scammers are very crafty and often make some very slight variation on the actual email address, so you really have to look very carefully.

If you receive an email similar to this, simply delete it and be aware that email scams, phishing, and more, are part of our digital world. To protect yourself, it's important that you learn how to recognize these scams.

In addition to email, the scammers also use text messaging for their same nefarious purpose. If a text message looks suspicious, it probably is. Once again, no one from St Agnes will ever ask you by text for money or gift cards!








Holiday Saints of the Season

Saint John, Apostle and Evangelist (1st century) December 27

An evangelist is a "bringer of good news." Today we hear the term applied to preachers, usually those who travel from place to place or appear on television telling others about Jesus and his call to build the Kingdom of God. But evangelist is also a term used for a writer of one of the Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Saint John and his brother, Saint James, made their living by fishing in the Sea of Galilee. One day while they were mending their nets, Jesus walked by. He called to them, and they left their work to follow him. Throughout Jesus' public life, he was close to John. In fact, John is called "the beloved disciple." He was with Jesus, along with Peter and James, at Jesus' Transfiguration. The same three were with Jesus during his agony in the garden. John was the only Apostle to stand at the foot of Jesus' Cross at the Crucifixion, when Jesus told him to care for his mother, Mary.



John also wrote three letters (we call them *Epistles*) addressed to various Christian communities of the first century. In writing his Gospel as well as his Epistles, John was able to think seriously about the events that occurred in his youth. He knew Jesus. John was with Jesus at the major events of his life and even saw him after the Resurrection. He wrote about the meaning of Jesus' life, how it changes each of us, and about the salvation God offers all of humankind. Because John's work is full of thoughts that soar to the heavens, his symbol is the eagle.

John is the only Apostle who was not a martyr. He lived to a great age, and it is said that when he could no longer walk, he was carried to meetings of his community. When asked to preach, he would say only, "My children, love one another. If you will just do that, you will do enough."

Adult Faith Formation Courses

Two five-week courses are being offered through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation (VLCFF) in the first part of 2023. These courses are hybrid models. They are composed of both weekly live two-hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF). The courses are being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Office of Evangelization & Catechesis, who pays 100% of the tuition and the cost of any books associated with the courses. <u>Survey of Catholic Doctrine</u> January 9th - February 12th, 2023

Have you ever wanted to explore your faith more deeply and understand more clearly the Trinity, Jesus as God's self revealed, the Holy Spirit and much more? We will study some of the major doctrines of the Catholic Church through the five week hybrid course Survey of Catholic Doctrine, a course sponsored through the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston and the University of Dayton Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation, it will run from January 9th to February 12th. There are no prerequisites, just bring your questions and a desire to learn about your faith. This course combines Zoom lectures/discussions once a week on Wednesday evenings from 7-9pm led by Dr. Rodica Stoicoiu with materials available online through the VLCFF website and meets the course requirement for catechetical certification for the diocese. New Testament

January 9th-February 12th, 2023

This course builds on the material learned in Introduction to Scripture and assumes a basic understanding of how Catholics read and interpret Scripture. We will explore the world behind the text of the New Testament, its history and culture, as well as examine how we today read and understand these texts in light of our own world and culture. We will look at how all four Gospels developed, study the letters of Paul, and examine the world of first century Christianity. This is a five-week hybrid course offered through the Diocese and the Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation of the University of Dayton. St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

In her engaging, insightful book of 2022, <u>Under The Skin-The Hidden Toll of Racism on American Lives and the</u>
Health of Our Nation, Linda Villarosa writes:

"Whereas in the past, race was considered a risk factor for a number of health conditions and early death, now it is clear that we must speak the harder truth: it's not race, something about being Black, or something wrong with the Black body, but racism that makes people sick and shortens their lives. Even after science finds a cure for COVID-19, racism in medicine is the harder the virus to kill."

While helping to document the poorer health outcomes among Black Americans compared to their White counterparts, attributable to poverty, availability of health insurance and healthcare, environmental racism and governmental neglect, she spotlights how we also now know that constantly coping with the stress of enduring racism in America, "weathers" Black people of all economic levels, prematurely aging them and making them more susceptible to health problems.

At this time of year when we Christians focus on honoring the birth of Jesus and Mary his mother, Villarosa recounts a number of stories of bad outcomes for Black mothers and their babies due to racism. She notes at one point a study of Black immigrant women in the United States whose health outcomes for their pregnancies were found to be significantly better than that of their daughters who were born here and grew up here. It was found, correcting for other factors, that racism was a significant factor in their daughters' poor pregnancy outcomes, regardless of their economic status.

Seeing God's saving presence in Mary's birthing of Jesus in a lowly stable, after a late-term, pregnant woman's uncomfortable journey, in an unfamiliar community with little support, hopefully opens our eyes to seeing and serving the needs of mothers and their babies who face special challenges, due to the color of their skin.

Updating Our VIRTUS (Protecting Our Youth)

As per diocesan policy, all people who work with youth in the parish need to be trained in VIRTUS. The program is completely online and requires only about 1 hour of your time. We all want our children to thrive in a safe and nurturing environment. IRA Charitable Gifts & Charitable Benefits Under the CARES ACT

A gift through your IRA is a great way to support St Agnes. Here is some information on how you can maximize your giving in 2022:

IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

- Donors age 70½ or older may make a gift of any amount, up to \$100,000 per individual (\$200,000 for couples with individual IRA accounts), from your IRA without paying income tax on the donated amount.
- For donors who have a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), making a gift directly from your IRA to St. Agnes can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, as long as certain rules are met.
- In addition to the benefits of giving to charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare.
- QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to the recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.
- Funds should be transferred directly from the donor's financial institution to St. Agnes.


