

Dear Parishioners,

I want to share with you something that has been developing in the parish. There are those who are using their field of expertise to put safety plans in place for our parish. This falls primarily under my leadership as pastor and staff who are responsible for the day-to-day operations. We will be working closely as we slowly develop a plan that is wholistic and based upon the Catholic social teaching of the church. The work is also ecumenical in nature because it has an effect on all faith communities. We have already been in dialogue with other churches in our ministerial association who bring great wisdom and remind us we do not have to necessarily reinvent the wheel. I want to be clear that those who are doing liturgical ministry will play a small, minimal role, but not an unimportant one. I will be making decisions along with the parish leadership that work with liturgy to decide what that looks like. My goal is that this will not be an added burden on ministry, but it will be nice to know there are resources and people that can be relied on in case of emergency, which is most likely to be medical. We have medical folks and first responders who do this work every day, so they will be the primary resources we will use. This is just the beginning of a large plan. It is important to remember that as Catholics we think of things beyond just our own walls and into the larger society and the systemic issues that need to be addressed for the common good. I thank those on the committee for their work. You will see something in the bulletin from the committee in the coming weeks.

Our Policy for Protecting Our Children

Please know that we follow the <u>Diocesan Safe Environment Program</u> in all our youth programs. All staff and volunteers who work with youth are required to complete the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston's Safe Environment program. **All** adult parishioners are **encouraged** to complete the program to increase awareness and provide a safe environment for the children of our parish and greater community. The process is completely online now. There are directions available in the Narthex for both creating a new Virtus account as well as directions available to help you log into your VIRTUS account if you already have an account.

Safe Environment Certification includes:

- 1. Virtus workshop Complete online training at www.virtusonline.org. Step-by-step instructions are available.
- Background Check Completing Screening One form
- Diocesan Policy Reading the Diocesan Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children & completing the DWC Policy form



A Valentine for Someone Special!



February 14th Honoring Saint Valentine



Saint Valentine is not officially honored on the Church's liturgical calendar. Still, this third-century saint is well-celebrated every February 14. Saint Valentine's Day is rooted in an act of disobedience. Although he was ordered not to by the emperor Claudius, Valentine honored the wish of soldiers by marrying them to their sweethearts before going into battle. For this reason, he is known as the patron of engaged couples and happy marriages.



The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

The Law of Moses contains 613 laws. Some of these laws are simple, basic, you-shall or you-shall-not commands, of which the Ten Commandments are typical. Some of these laws govern worship. A good many of the 613 laws are what-if laws that apply the Commandments to everyday life. In the Gospel, Jesus' New Law asks people to deepen their keeping of the laws and to follow his new Law of Love.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Rules give children a way to know they belong. They experience rules by being members of a family and a class that keep the same rules they do. Talk about family rules with your child. Share why the rules are important for everyone. Be sure to pray the Our Father, which was part of this week's lesson, and help your child become familiar with the family Bible.

Promise (Grades K-1): The class learned how families keep rules. Ask your child what Jesus' Law of Love is. Your child learned how God's family keeps rules, so talk about your family's rules and how they help. The Word of the Week is the Ten Commandments, so consider listing those important rules in a prominent place in your home.

Good News (Grades 2–3): This week, your child learned to recognize good moral actions. Your child also learned what the Ten Commandments and Christian morality are and how they help all to do what is right. Talk about how Jesus' teaching deepens the Commandments, and how the rules you have in your family help all of you make right decisions and care for one another.

Venture (Grades 4–6): Your young person learned that there is a similarity between the Ten Commandments and the rules every family needs to live by. The class read a story of a middle schooler who went against his conscience to fit in with the popular crowd. Invite your young person to summarize the story for the family, and affirm that it is important to listen to your conscience when making decisions. Talk about how you can apply Jesus' Law of Love to the arguments and conflicts your family might have. Take a few moments to ask one another's forgiveness for hurtful words or actions. When you finish your conversation, you may want to share a sign of peace, like you do at Sunday Mass.

Visions (Grades 7–9): This week's class began with a look at the Ten Commandments. Your youngster also explored ways to manage feelings of anger and ways to seek forgiveness. Invite him or her to share thee story "Anh's Anger" with the family. Talk together about Jesus' new Law of Love and how important it is for a Christian to show love for God by loving one's neighbor as well. Discuss the importance of following moral laws and how these laws help people show love for one another. Talk, too, about how Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians continues to help Christians today.

Pray Together

Plan a special treat for the whole family. Before you share the treat together, share words of love and appreciation with one another. Then, ask God to bless your family with the gift of enduring love. Enjoy the treat, then hold hands and thank God in a prayer for all he has given and done to bless your family.

St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

"Until we can see the cross and the lynching tree together, until we can identify Christ with a "recrucified" black body hanging from a lynching tree, there can be no genuine understanding of Christian identity in America, and no deliverance from the brutal legacy of slavery and white supremacy." (James H. Cone, <u>The Cross and the Lynching Tree</u>)

Jesus of Nazareth was, in reality, essentially a victim of a lynch mob that clamored for his death, that demanded the common method of public execution and shaming of their day, crucifixion. Like a "legal" lynching in Jim Crow America, it was meant to serve as a powerful, public spectacle to instill terror in anyone who might be associated with or seek to imitate the victim.

As Patrick Saint-Jean, S.J., a young Black Jesuit, suggests in his recent book, The Crucible of Racism, imagine if you will, that Jesus had been lynched instead of crucified. Imagine, instead of a cross as the symbol of our faith, we had a noose - to be worn around our necks and to adorn our churches. It would be in our culture, a deeply unsettling, constant reminder of the brutal reality of Jesus' death, and the immense cost of his counter-cultural mission to bring justice and hope to all, especially to those relegated to society's margins. Perhaps we might take the call to discipleship more seriously if we understood the cross in this way. Martin Luther King Jr. did. As he said, the cross "is not something you wear. The cross is something that you bear and that you ultimately die on." Like Martin Luther King, Jr., Black Christians in America have a unique awareness of and ready identification with the cross of Jesus. There is a lot to learn from their lived faith experience.

Ugly Sleeping Bag Ministry

This year we have made 27 sleeping bags and donated 23 used and new sleeping bags. This has given us a total of 50 sleeping bags distributed to two agencies who serve the homeless, JCCM in Jefferson County and Immanuel's House in Berkeley County.

We are still in need of donated **blankets**, and **comforters** (any size) and also used **sleeping bags**. Items should be clean and in fair condition and can be dropped off at the parish center.

St. Mary Recycle Mission Group has been working with Catholic churches, Convents, Schools, The Knights of Columbus, and other organizations, as well as with Parishioners who have things at home in helping rescue and recycle used Religious items that are no longer needed. Over the last 25 years, they have helped recycle items from Churches that unfortunately were closing, items from former Clergy that are not being used, as well as from Parishioners who need to place their personal religious items from home that they don't know what to do with.
