

Going to El Salvador was truly a transforming experience; one that I will be processing for a long time. I realized being there that I was being evangelized by the church and people of El Salvador. I also got, with all my senses, a better understanding of how Pope Francis is guiding our church. I leave you with one image on synodality. A real gift to our trip is that Bishop Evelio Menjivar Ayala, the auxiliary bishop of Washington D.C. who is from El Salvador, joined us and really helped us to understand the history of the church and culture. One day we had to walk a long way in the mountains because, going to lunch, our bus got hung up. As I was walking in the mountains with Bishop Evelio and the rest of our group, a fellow on our trip named Jose, also from El Salvador, trailed out way ahead of us. Bishop Evelio gave this as a good example of Synodality. The bishop said he told a group of young people go ahead you can run out ahead but then wait for others to catch up. This is synodality. He said, the Germans, look at them. They are running out way ahead pushing the church to move forward, but then they need to wait for the church to catch up. We hear in the Gospel of Mark this weekend about Jesus' healings and miracles. When Jesus went out ahead, the disciples pursued him. Jesus was not going back but moving ahead. May we as church not be afraid to move forward on our mission.

Souper Bowl of Caring

Seeking to love God by loving their neighbors, America's teens are transforming Super Bowl weekend into the nation's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving through Souper Bowl of Caring. On the weekend prior to the Super Bowl and on Super Bowl Sunday weekend, youth collect one dollar (or more) donations in soup pots as worshippers leave church. Each group donates their collection directly to the charity of their choice— here at St. Agnes, our donations will be split between the Shepherdstown Shares food pantry and the JCCM food pantry that serve our community. Watch for our youth and their soup pots after each Mass on February 3rd and 4th as well as February 10th and 11th (Super Bowl Sunday). In addition, you can give online again this year. Preparing for Lent

Fasting Guidelines

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by everyone 18 years and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken, according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed. In addition, fasting can also take the form of deliberate abstinence from things other than food such as selfishness, gossip, bickering, sloth, electronics, television, smoking, etc.

Abstinence Guidelines

Abstinence is observed by everyone 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work is affected, the law does not oblige. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.

Stations of the Cross

Beginning on Friday, February 23, and each Friday in Lent thereafter, we will be offering Stations of the Cross at 7pm at the church. Stations of the Cross are a meaningful way to pray and meditate on Christ's sacrifice for us. As always, all are welcome!





The Gospel at Home

This Sunday's Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus brings God's life-giving, healing power to the people of Galilee. The Gospel portrays Jesus as a man of action who raises up Peter's mother-in-law, heals the sick, and frees the possessed. He also seeks time to pray. We are all called to imitate Jesus' compassion and love for people.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Promise (Grades K-1): Your child learned in class that he or she can be of help to others. Talk together about ways the members of your family help one another. Ask your child to share the story "Ben and the Sad Face" with the family. Talk, too, about ways Jesus helped people from this week's Gospel reading. Together, take a look at the booklet about Jesus helping others that your child made during this week's lesson.

Good News (Grades 2-3): Your child learned about Saint Martin de Porres. Ask your child to share his story with the family. Your child learned the names of all Seven Sacraments. Ask him or her to describe what a sacrament is and see if he or she can name all seven. The class also learned more about the Gospel of Saint Mark. Let everyone in the family look at the little booklet your child put together in class. Let your child share what he or she learned about Mark's Gospel.

Venture (Grades 4-6): This week, your youngster learned about the healing ministry of Jesus. Your child explored about the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick—the sacrament that brings help and healing to people suffering from illness. Discuss ways that you can make a difference in the lives of people who are hurting. Ask your young one who Saint Josephine Bakhita was, and take a look at the Gospel Booklet made this week.

Visions (Grades 7-9): During this week's class, your son or daughter saw how Jesus used prayer to help heal the sick and spiritually troubled. Ask your youngster about the lesson from the story, "Who Wins?" Ask your son or daughter to tell you about the first female disciple of Jesus. Discuss how you and your family resolve conflicts, and your youngster can tell you what he or she learned in class about it.

Pray Together

When you complete your conversation about Sunday's Gospel lesson, create a family litany for people who are suffering from illness or who are struggling in life. Let members of the family take turns mentioning the name of a person who is in need. After each name, the family can respond, "Lord, make haste to help them." When the family runs out of names, close by saying the Lord's Prayer together.



In addition to the methods listed above for reporting sexual abuse, the Diocese also has partnered with Navex Global to offer the **EthicsPoint** platform to report other, additional concerns, such as suspected financial, professional, and personal misconduct of a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee of the Diocese or any Catholic parish or school in West Virginia. The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.


