

Souper Bowl of Caring

Seeking to love God by loving their neighbors, America's teens are transforming Super Bowl weekend into the nation's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving through Souper Bowl of Caring. On the weekend prior to the Super Bowl and on Super Bowl Sunday weekend, youth collect one dollar (or more) donations in soup pots as worshippers leave church. Each group donates their collection directly to the charity of their choice— here at St. Agnes, our donations will be split between the Shepherdstown Shares food pantry and the JCCM food pantry that serve our community.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend I am thankful for Father Mat who is covering this weekend's Masses while I will be in El Salvador. As I think of Father Mat and St Agnes, I know that St Agnes has been committed to Vatican II long before I arrived. As your pastor, we have been doing some exciting things with the Synod. It's important to remember though that we can do what we do now because we stand on the shoulders of giants. Recently in my reflection on St Agnes, I have been thinking about our young and elders. What comes to me is we are a community of Elis and Samuels, our older members being the Elis and our younger members being the Samuels. So, I offer this thought to our Elis, our younger folks need you to point them in the right direction; they can learn from your wisdom, but the younger members, they have maybe a different way of going about it that we need to honor. For our younger folks, seek the wisdom of our elders; recognize that they have experience that can help you tackle new challenges. This is the beauty of synodality, and I watch the Samuels and Elis at St Agnes work together here in beautiful ways. It's important that all voices be heard as we move forward in a synodal way. We are in another Stage of Vatican II with the Synod that we will be implementing for a long time, but we have a strong foundation thanks to all the Elis and Samuels in this community. I would say we are a church of Pentecost with the fire burning brightly and, as Acts of the Apostles says in Chapter 2:17, "I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh: your sons and daughters shall prophesy, and your young see visions, and your old dream dreams." This is synodality. I will be praying for all of you as I go to El Salvador asking for Archbishop Romero's intercession that we may continue to grow as a synodal church at St Agnes.

All St Agnes Volunteers... Must Be VIRTUS Trained

The Diocese of Wheeling Charleston requires that all volunteers in all parishes, schools, etc., must be Virtus trained. **And they will soon be auditing to verify compliance. If you volunteer in any capacity at St Agnes, you must do the training!**

VIRTUS training is designed to help adults recognize the signs that indicate a child or vulnerable adult might be suffering abuse. It also helps adults by offering key points to help children and adults, who might confide in them, deal with potential situations. Finally, it helps adults know who to contact and what the next steps are if they suspect or discover a child or vulnerable adult is being abused. All this training is designed to help adults help others through a difficult situation.

It is truly in the best interests of everyone to have all volunteers VIRTUS trained.

The good news is that the training is all online and can be completed in a short period of time. Our Coordinator, Bill Donahue, can assist with verifying your training status and/or initiating your training. Religious Item Recycling

St. Mary Recycle Mission Group has been working with Catholic churches, Convents, Schools, The Knights of Columbus, and other organizations, as well as with Parishioners who have things at home in helping rescue and recycle used Religious items that are no longer needed.

Over the last 25 years, they have helped recycle items from Churches that have items from former Clergy that are no longer being used, or from Churches that unfortunately closed, as well as from Parishioners who need to place their personal religious items from home that they don't know what to do with. Over the years, they have found many of these items in the trash so they came up with a recycling program. They originally got started after finding several items cleared out from a church basement in the dumpster of a local church all in perfectly usable condition. They later found that there is a need for these unwanted items. Their first large effort was following Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans as they sent hundreds of recycled items to a parish there that was more than happy to accept items for both the parish and parishioners that they had gathered.

They can take in or give just about anything of Religious nature that can be used by other churches, convents or religious organizations such as:

The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
