

## Reuse/Recycling of Religious Items

St. Mary Recycle Mission Group has been working with Catholic churches, Convents, Schools, The Knights of Columbus, and other organizations, as well as with Parishioners who have things at home in helping rescue and recycle used Religious items that are no longer needed. Over the last 25 years, they have helped recycle items from Churches that unfortunately were closing, items from former Clergy that are not being used, as well as from Parishioners who need to place their personal religious items from home that they don't know what to do with. Their first large effort was following Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans where they sent hundreds of recycled items to a parish.

Family Guide January 29, 2023 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

## The Gospel at Home

#### This Week's Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

In the Gospel, Jesus climbs on a mountainside to teach the Beatitudes. Those who live by these eight principles will learn about how to live like Jesus. The Sermon on the Mount will show us how to experience happiness even in the most trying times. The lowly are uplifted by these teachings. God gives us life and wants us all to be happy.

#### Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Your child learned that Jesus' teachings will bring us happiness. Ask your child about the Beatitudes, which Jesus taught during the Sermon on the Mount. Together as a family, try to make a list of what the teachings are. If you need help, go to this week's Gospel reading. Talk about how to live the Beatitudes as a family.

**Promise** (Grades K-1): Your child explored Jesus' teachings that will help us be happy. Discuss what makes each person in your family happy and how that might fit into the Beatitudes. What are some of the times you have celebrated with each member of the family? Could be birthday, Baptisms, or some other milestone. Pray for continued happiness for your family and others in the community.

**Good News** (Grades 2-3): What kind of blessings has your family experienced that makes you all happy? Those are the kind of things your child's class discussed this week. Talk about your faith, family and friends, and life in general. Ask your child to summarize the story from this week's lesson titled, "A Colorful Gift." Talk about the Beatitudes and include them in your weekly prayers. How do the Beatitudes help us find true happiness? Venture (Grades 4-6): This week your youngster's class learned about God's Law and Jesus' new law. Ask your son or daughter to describe what happened in the story, "Sadako and the 1,000 Cranes." The Gospel reading about the Beatitudes teaches us how to be happy. See how many beatitudes your young person can remember. Discuss as a family what the Liturgy of the Word means to you. Have your young person describe who Saint John Bosco is. Besides the Beatitudes, discuss the other teachings from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. End with the Lord's Prayer.

Visions (Grades 7-9): How much do Moses and Jesus have in common? Your young person should be able to answer that. Plus, talk about what happened in this week's story about Martin Luther King Jr. called "When Even the Children Can Lead." How did the people from the 1950s account fit into Jesus' teaching on the Beatitudes? How do the Beatitudes teach us to think like God? Discuss these questions with your young person. What other teachings from the Sermon on the Mount can your youngster share with the family?

#### Pray Together

Gather the family at the kitchen table. In the center of the table, place the family Bible and a lighted candle. Let each person in the family ask for God's help in spreading the happiness of the Beatitudes. After each person has a say, all can respond with the words, "Jesus you are the source of all happiness." End with the Lord's Prayer.







## St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

On June 5, 1934 in Germany, a group of Nazi government officials met to begin planning the implementation of their Aryan supremacist ideology. The first item on their agenda was what could be learned from the United States. Hitler and his followers had marveled at how the United States managed to successfully and efficiently subjugate millions of its people according to racial standards based on white supremacy, while still claiming and maintaining worldwide respect as a beacon of democracy. They were amazed at how a professedly democratic nation had gotten away with its enslavement, mass killings, "legal" lynchings, and systematic denials of basic human rights. They focused on the United States as the model to follow in accomplishing their own racial agenda.

Few Americans are aware of how the United States inspired Hitler and his followers. Admittedly, Nazis went beyond what the United States had done, but we helped show the way. As Americans we have a very different view of ourselves, clouded by our own immersion in our country's history and the lack of full knowledge of that history. There is still much work to be done as Christians in the service of truth and justice for all God's children. This particular reflection is based on documented information that appears in Isabel Wilkerson's book, <u>Caste -</u> <u>The Origins of Our Discontent</u>. This book has been added to our St. Agnes racial justice library in the church nar-

thex. One reviewer of this book commented insightfully: "Wilkerson's work is the missing puzzle piece of our country's history."

## AmazonSmile Program Is Ending

We were recently notified that Amazon is winding down its AmazonSmile program by February 20, 2022. ## Our Policy for Protecting Our Children

Please know that we follow the <u>Diocesan Safe Environ-</u><u>ment Program</u> in all our youth programs. All staff and volunteers who work with youth are required to complete the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston's Safe Environment program. **All** adult parishioners are **encouraged** to complete the program to increase awareness and provide a safe environment for the children of our parish and greater community. The process is completely online now.

Safe Environment Certification includes:

- 1. Virtus workshop Complete online training at <u>www.virtusonline.org</u>. Step-by-step instructions are available.
- 2. Background Check Completing Screening One form
- Diocesan Policy Reading the Diocesan Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children & completing the DWC Policy form

All of the above steps are now completed online. If you do not have access for this online procedure, please contact St. Agnes Parish Office at 304-876-6436.

If you already have a VIRTUS account, log into your account and complete any required updates. If you are new to VIRTUS, select the green box "First-time Registrant" and follow the prompts to create an account and to complete the required training and paperwork.

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston maintains an Office of Safe Environment in accordance with the USCCB's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. To Report Suspected Cases of Sexual Abuse of Children: The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston encourages reporting to civil authorities first and foremost if a crime has been committed. We also encourage utilizing www.reportbishopabuse.org to make a report about any bishop in the U.S. If you have reason to believe that a bishop has engaged in sexual misconduct, please contact civil authorities in the applicable jurisdiction and visit www.reportbishopabuse.org. To Report to Civil Authorities: Contact your local law enforcement; numbers will vary based on your location. If you believe someone is in immediate danger, call 911. To confidentially report any incidence of suspected child abuse or neglect, including sexual abuse, contact the West Virginia Bureau for Children and Families' Child Protective Services by calling the Child Abuse Hotline at 800.352.6513. To Report to Diocesan Authorities: In addition to civil authorities, the diocese encourages reporting to the appropriate church authorities. To report suspected cases of sexual abuse of children by personnel of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to the Diocese, contact one of the following designees at 1.888.434.6237 or 304.233.0880: Mr. Bryan Minor, ext. 263; Mr. Tim Bishop, ext. 353; or Very Rev. Dennis Schuelkens, Jr., V.E., ext. 270. You may also call the Diocese's Office of Safe Environment at 304.230.1504. In addition to the methods listed above for reporting sexual abuse, the Diocese also has partnered with Navex Global to offer the EthicsPoint platform to report other, additional concerns, such as suspected financial, professional, and personal misconduct of a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee of the Diocese or any Catholic parish or school in West Virginia. The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
