
## Saint Agnes

#### **CCHD Collections**

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is the domestic anti-poverty program of the bishops of the United States. Founded in 1969, CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty by funding organizations where lowincome people participate in grassroots organizations for community and economic development. In recent years CCHD has provided grants for two West Virginia entities: a Catholic Worker House helping the poor and homeless with employment and other issues, and the Wheeling Food Hub developing a commercial kitchen, retail facility, and warehouse in an urban food desert. Consideration of a grant to another West Virginia entity, Able Families in the Kermit community, is in the beginning stages. Funding for CCHD is by an annual parish collection which will be held next weekend on July 20th & 21st. Please take a look at our bulletin insert this week to learn more about this vital ministry. And please consider a generous gift to CCHD. Checks should be made out to St Agnes with CCHD on the memo line. Clearly marked donations can be placed in the collection at Mass, or feel free to mail your donation to the office. We have envelopes in the narthex that are marked CCHD to use in the offertory.

Dear Parishioners,

I always learn so much from the group of parishioners that gather for our Monday afternoon scripture study. This past week, a parishioner, who is a scientist, offered this insight that I found fascinating. He said that the more you discover in science, the more you realize how much you do not know. We then discussed how this is important for us as a church because no matter what we know of God the more we realize what we do not know. Some theologians say that the best name we can have for God is absolute mystery. This, I think, calls us to have qualities of humility and curiosity, and to realize we are part of that mystery constantly unfolding. Reflecting on the gospel this weekend, I think that it calls us to take risks and to try new things because Jesus is about new beginnings. I wonder about when those first disciples were sent out, they had to let go of their need to be in control, but what new things did they discover about the reign of God? What things did they need to let go of that were obstacles? I even wonder when they gathered with Jesus, who we can forget was fully human, what insights he learned from those he sent out on mission. In this past weekend's homily, I quoted Steve Jobs, because I think his ideas, given this God of love and surprises calls us to take risks and be open to God's new beginnings, is appropriate for us as followers of Jesus, "Here's to the crazy ones. The misfits. The rebels. The troublemakers. The round pegs in the square holes. The ones who see things differently. They're not fond of rules. And they have no respect for the status quo. You can quote them, disagree with them, glorify, or vilify them. About the only thing you can't do is ignore them. Because they change things. They push the human race forward. And while some may see them as the crazy ones, we see genius. Because the people who are crazy enough to think they can change the world, are the ones who do." Maybe those who are willing to take the risks will change the world.

#### Fourth of July Quilt Raffle Results

#### WE HAVE A WINNER!

The winner of the Americana Quilt is Kathleen Bielicki.

She was surprised, shocked and delighted, and said she never wins anything, but she has now and is very happy. Thanks to everyone who bought raffle tickets or made donations, we reached our goal of \$300 – the price tag on the quilt – and then went above and beyond. The final total was \$469, over 150% of our goal. We divided the proceeds between the St Agnes Youth Group and the Kolofata Girls Education Project. Since the Kolofata Project has a match from an anonymous donor, its portion of the proceeds has been doubled! Everyone is happy, except the raffle losers who are being gracious.

#### Important Virtus Update

If you have recently logged into your VIRTUS account, you may have noticed that you might have a new module assigned for you to complete.

What does that mean and why: Anyone who completed their VIRTUS training before 2022 is being asked to complete VIRTUS 4.0, an update to their training. If you completed training in 2022 or later, you have already completed the VIRTUS 4.0 training.

Why are volunteers and staff with older training being asked to update? There are actually a couple of reasons.

First, some of the information regarding safe environment has changed over the years. For example, trainings now include information about online safety which wasn't even considered in the 1990's when training began. Second, the definition of Safe Environment has changed over the years. No longer is it just about children and youth. It now includes vulnerable adults. Also, as experts learn more information regarding Safe Environment, VIRTUS trainings have been updated so they reflect the new information. Finally, when the diocese is audited yearly for Safe Environment, the Diocese of Wheeling/ Charleston has been consistently been marked as deficient for not having staff and volunteers updated with the latest information to help keep our children, youth and vulnerable adults safe.

Therefore, the Bishop decided that the best option at this point was to ask all staff and volunteers to update their VIRTUS training to VIRTUS 4.0. Again, individuals that have completed VIRTUS training after 2022 already have the latest training, so there is nothing for them to do. For those of us that completed training before 2022, we can update our training by logging into our online VIRTUS account and clicking on the link under our Training Module Block and completing the new training. Another way to update your VIRTUS training will include an in-person option. Bill Donahue will be offering in-person training sessions where people can opt to complete their updated training instead of completing it online. Dates for the in-person training will be announced later.

The Diocesan Office of Safe Environment and the Bishop have also asked volunteers and staff to begin reading Monthly Safety Bulletins. You might have noticed that this block is also now on your VIRTUS logged in home screen. You can read the safety bulletin from your logged in account. You can also pick up a copy of the Safety Bulletin in the Narthex at the church or in the parish center. Finally, we plan to include the Safety Bulletin once a month in the bulletin. The purpose of these Safety Bulletins is just another way to keep current with the latest information about keeping our children, youth, and vulnerable adults safe. The information presented in these bulletins is truly excellent knowledge for everyone.

As always, if you have questions regarding this latest update or need assistance logging into your VIRTUS account, please call Bill Donahue at the parish center or email him at <a href="mailto:formation@stagnesshepherdstown.org">formation@stagnesshepherdstown.org</a>. We have been asked by the Bishop to have our VIRTUS accounts updated to version 4.0 by December 31, 2024.

#### Spotlight on Ministry

It's very important that, as **Proclaimers of the Word**, all Lectors participate in regular workshop sessions so that we remain vigilant in our technique. Of course, no two readings are alike and no two Lectors are the same, but some factors need to be emphasized for every Lector and every reading. Volume and enunciation are critical and should be practiced by everyone. Joe will meet with individual Lectors after each Mass to make it convenient for you, and we would like everyone to participate. Individual sessions won't take more than 30 minutes.

Please email Joe Yates and cc Helen Harris with your availability so that we can schedule individual times.

None of us are perfect; we want all Lectors to participate.

Also, I am currently working on an updated training sessions for Hospitality, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, and Mass Coordinator. These trainings will continue to be scheduled until all have had an opportunity to attend. Some of these training sessions will be held to make it more convenient.





#### **Gospel Reading**


Mark 6:7-13

Jesus instructs his disciples and sends them to preach repentance.

#### **Family Connection**

Families who work together to accomplish routine household tasks know that the benefits are more than efficiency. In sharing daily tasks, we accomplish more, but we also build relationships that last—and it's a lot more fun! Jesus sent his disciples in pairs to minister in his name. Perhaps the job was accomplished more effectively this way, but more importantly, Jesus' mission was accomplished more authentically. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it.

As you gather as a family, talk about some household tasks that are more easily accomplished when two or more people work together. Talk about how working together not only makes the job easier, but also makes the task more fun because we are able to spend time together. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:7-13. Ask: Why do you think Jesus sent out his disciples in pairs? Observe that Jesus continues to give us a community with which we share our life of discipleship—our family and the community of the Church. Conclude in prayer together that we will continue to rely on the support of the community of the Church in our life of discipleship. Pray together the <u>Prayer to the Holy Spirit</u>.

In addition to the methods listed above for reporting sexual abuse, the Diocese also has partnered with Navex Global to offer the EthicsPoint platform to report other, additional concerns, such as suspected financial, professional, and personal misconduct of a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee of the Diocese or any Catholic parish or school in West Virginia. The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
