Emergency Response Committee

The recently formed St. Agnes Emergency Response Committee (SAERC) is developing plans to respond to emergencies at our facilities. While many steps have been taken over the years to provide a safe environment for our parishioners, we felt that we could enhance those actions by putting plans and structures in place to make sure all possible emergency scenarios are covered. It's a big task so we decided to prioritize our actions and focus on medical emergencies first. We have already begun by holding several training sessions for hospitality staff in CPR and First Aid.

We envision teams of parishioners who are assigned certain roles at each Mass and can be called to act in case of an emergency. Our first step is to identify and train parishioners who are willing to participate. On that note, we are seeking members who:

- have some medical background such as doctors, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, RNs, EMT, etc.
- have some background in security or first responders such EMT, police, firefighters, military, etc.
- are simply willing to respond in an emergency.

Not all positions require technical skills. Some assignments are very basic as in calling 911.

This is a work in progress, but we feel it is important to assure all parishioners that as a community, we are prepared to respond and strive to create a safe and secure environment to worship.

Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat is a musical with lyrics by Tim Rice and music by Andrew Lloyd Webber, based on the character of Joseph from the Bible's Book of Genesis. Joseph is the favorite son of Jacob, and to show the world he loves his son, Jacob buys Joseph a coat of many colors. His jealous brothers sell Joseph to a group of hairy Ishmaelites, who then sell Joseph to an Egyptian noble. Joseph eventually lands in prison where his ability to interpret dreams gets him an audience with Pharaoh. Solving Pharaoh's dreams get Joseph a maximum promotion, becoming Egypt's second in command. When famine hits Canaan, Joseph's brothers travel to Egypt in search of food, and meet up with Joseph. Seeing that his brothers don't recognize Joseph, he tests them to see if they have changed their ways.

This upbeat, family-friendly musical stays true to the Biblical story. It originated as a school project in London, England in 1968. The first professional production was in London, in 1973, and the first production with the musical in it's current form was in 1974. In 1982 "Joseph" made its Broadway debut, and the show has been enjoyed by millions ever since.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY & HOMELESS

Through the Spring and possibly beyond, we will be providing descriptions of our Service, Justice and Peace Ministries with an emphasis on **unmet needs**. We're hoping that some parishioners will be inspired by the Spirit to lend a hand. We need all the help we can get!

Three Wednesday evenings a month, four when there is a fifth Wednesday as is happening four times this year, parishioners prepare, deliver and serve 50 to 60 carry out meals for the hungry and homeless. The Youth always prepare the fourth Wednesday meal. They do most or all of the preparation on Sunday at the parish center, volunteers box and deliver the meals that fourth Wednesday. The first and second (and fifth) Wednesdays, parishioners (individuals, families or teams) prepare the meals at home or at the parish center. We continue to provide \$150 in cash cards for food purchases. The chefs usually deliver the meals themselves but sometimes need help.

Prior to covid parishioners may remember our Social Concerns weekends, the third weekend of every month. We collected funds to subsidize these food costs, and for other ministries as well. We'll soon be restarting our Service, Justice & Peace weekends but more on that later.

A SECOND NEED - DELIVERING YOUTH PREPARED MEALS ON THE FOURTH WEDNESDAY EVENING OF EACH MONTH
The meal delivery is pretty simple: leave St. Agnes at 5 pm, usually for Mt. Zion Episcopal Church parish hall, 215 East Washington St., Charles Town; meal distribution starts at 5:30. With COVID restrictions reduced, food distribution is again indoors. This allows some of the recipients to eat there, and also allows for more interaction with the folks, which is a big deal. Generally, the dinner is within take-out containers, sometimes with an addition (dessert or fruit). We utilize recycled (donated) plastic grocery bags to put the meals together so they can be transported easily. Into the bag goes the meal(s) in the take-out container(s), a set of fork and knife (if needed) wrapped in a napkin, a bottle (or two) of water, and any addition (fruit or dessert) if needed.

The whole process takes about 30 minutes tops. Lately, as we have been moving back inside, we have more of an opportunity to interact, which was the whole point when we started this.






And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here so that they may believe that you sent me." When he said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth.

The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: John 11:1-45

Sunday's Gospel describes Jesus raising of his friend Lazarus from the dead. The story hints at Jesus' own Resurrection, which we will celebrate at Easter. The raising of Lazarus puts Jesus in danger from his enemies, but he risks his life to be with and to help his friends.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Young children learn about friendship from parents, siblings, playmates, teachers, and classmates. Friendship involves caring, helping, communicating, and sharing experiences. Remind your child that Jesus had friends whom he cared for, and Jesus' friends cared for him. Talk to your child about friendship and caring.

Promise (Grades K-1): Your child learned about the sadness Jesus felt when he found out that his friend Lazarus had died. Your child also learned that feelings are important. Ask your child to tell you what makes him or her sad, happy, lonely, afraid, or angry. Ask your child, too, to tell the story about how Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead.

Good News (Grades 2-3): Ask your child to share with the family the story "A Sad Time for Peter." Talk about the sad feelings Peter had when his dog died. Then talk about the meaning of Resurrection—going from death to life. Perhaps the family can visit the cemetery and pray for all the people who have died. In your regular or daily prayers, pray for family members who have died. Discuss how Jesus' Resurrection opened Heaven for us all.

Venture (Grades 4-6): Your young person's class learned about compassion and caring for others. Ask your son or daughter to share with the family the story "Remember the Children" about the Holocaust. Talk about the lessons of the Gospel story of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. Make and post a list of ways your family can show compassion and caring for others during the last weeks of Lent. Have your youngster tell the family about Saint Marguerite d'Youville. Discuss why mercy is important.

Visions (Grades 7-9): Your young person's class explored the meaning of friendship and the feelings associated with friendship. Ask your son or daughter to tell you about the "saint" who played video games. Talk about the steps to sainthood. Talk about Martha, Mary, and Lazarus and their friendship with Jesus. Does your family have a strong belief in Jesus, and do you experience Jesus' friendship? Do you seek Jesus' help when your family experiences sorrow or loss? What does the promise of Resurrection mean to each member of your family? Have your youngster tell the family about Ezekiel's command from God.

Pray Together


After dinner one evening, join in a "Lazarus Prayer." Each member of the family can tell the story of a family member, a friend, or even a well-known person who has died recently. After each story, say the following prayer. "Jesus, you promised that if we live and believe in you we will have life everlasting. Please come and grant him (or her) life forever with you."




St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

A front page article from this past Monday's Herald-Mail newspaper reported on the release from prison of nearly 3300 people since 1989, following the discovery of their innocence after formal reviews of their convictions. Some had served 40 years or more for crimes they did not commit. Though American Blacks make up only 13.6% of the population, they account for 53% of the exonerations. Statisticians calculate that a Black person is 7 times more likely to be wrongfully convicted of a crime than a white person. Reasons for the invalid convictions vary: official misconduct, perjury, false accusations, fake or misleading evidence, mistaken witness identification, forced false confessions, and inadequate legal representation. A significant factor, but not the only one, leading to these reasons for wrongful convictions for Blacks, is systemic racism, a factor seen throughout our American history.

The establishment of formal conviction review units, especially in the last two decades, has begun to more fully address this injustice. Today's Gospel story of Jesus, freeing Lazarus from the tomb and returning him to the fullness of his human life, reminds us the work of a disciple of Jesus is to bring people out of "tombs" and restore them to the fullness of life. By serving the cause of racial justice we are doing God's work.

A reminder - there are many great books in our Racial Justice Library in the church narthex that can aid us in doing this important ministry. They can help us to clearly "see" those who endure the pain of racism merely because of the color of their skin.

Cinco de Mayo

Cinco de Mayo Celebration

In addition to the methods listed above for reporting sexual abuse, the Diocese also has partnered with Navex Global to offer the **EthicsPoint** platform to report other, additional concerns, such as suspected financial, professional, and personal misconduct of a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee of the Diocese or any Catholic parish or school in West Virginia. The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
