Please Don't Fall Victim To Email and Texting Scams!

Lately we are hearing from far too many parishioners that they are receiving emails or text messages from someone posing as Fr. Andy or Fr. Mat. **If you ever receive an email or text from someone posing as St. Agnes staff asking for money, gift cards, etc., it's a** <u>SCAM</u>.

No one, not Fr. Andy nor Fr. Mat nor St. Agnes staff, will <u>EVER</u> write to you personally asking for 'favors' or to re-<u>quest for you to make a purchase or send money</u>. You can usually tell by looking closely at the email address who sent the message. Emails from St. Agnes always come from <u>office@stagnesshepherdstown.org</u>. Emails from Fr. Andy will be from <u>aswitzer@dwc.org</u> or <u>aswitzer@stagnesshepherdstown.org</u>. These scammers are very crafty and often make some very slight variation on the actual email address, so you really have to look very carefully.

If you receive an email similar to this, simply delete it and be aware that online scams, etc. are part of our digital world. To protect yourself, it's important that you learn how to recognize these scams.

Dear Parishioners,

On Monday, we had our Bible study, and the group always has so many insights. I find I learn a lot that helps me to prepare for the weekend. One image that was shared was a family photo album and how, when you look through it, we often discover things we did not know before. This perhaps might be a good way to look at the Easter Vigil. We, in a sense, travel through our family photo album. And in one real sense, almost like a sci-fi movie, we travel back in time to hear the stories of our ancestors that have been passed down to us. We start with the story of creation, then the early matriarchs and patriarchs, the prophets, the poetry from the Psalms, and culminating with the Easter story. We then add our newest members, through Baptism, as part of the St Agnes family. These, each year, are our newest members in the photo album. You think about how large this album is with all the baptisms that have happened at St Agnes in what is now the historic chapel and then continues at our church now. These newest members who join the family album renew us each year. They help us to return to our youthfulness, refreshed and renewed by resurrection. Through the wisdom of church on the night of the Vigil, we recognize that the newest members lead us as they receive Baptism, and then we renew our baptismal promises. They then provide us with instruction until Pentecost. These newest members tell us, as they experience the sacraments for the first time, what they have tasted, felt, seen, and heard. They help us to see the Resurrection with new eyes. As we move through the family album this Easter, may our newest members renew our youthfulness and fill us with Easter Joy.

Be Prepared for the Eclipse!

A near-total solar eclipse is coming to our area! On Monday April 8th, around 3-3:30pm, the sun will be almost completely eclipsed by the moon. But be wary! You will need special glasses to view the sun during these moments, and be careful to purchase real ones—**fakes and knockoffs are abundant**. Looking directly at the sun's rays at this time can cause damage to your eyes so make sure to have proper, REAL protection during this amazing event. It won't happen for another 20 years—so make sure you can see it properly if the weather allows! Simple Acts to Save Our Planet

With Earth Day fast approaching on April 22nd, our thoughts turn to caring for our planet. Some excerpts from *Simple Acts to Save Our Planet—500 Ways to Make a Difference* by Michelle Neff:

- Reuse old socks or T-shirts for cleaning. Instead of throwing them out, **reuse old clothes** for car cleaning or even general cleaning around the house.
- Keep your fridge free of frost. A buildup of frost and ice only drives up your **energy use**. Check your freezer occasionally to see if there is unnecessary frost.
- Don't put hot food in the fridge. Putting hot food in the fridge makes the fridge work overtime trying to cool it down. Let it cool to **room temperature** before putting the food in the fridge.
- Use natural gas instead of charcoal for grilling. Charcoal produces tiny particles that pollute the air. By using propane or natural gas instead of charcoal, you won't be contributing to air pollution. Better yet, use an **electric grill** that is powered by the sun or wind and you'll really be grilling green!

Let's Show the Earth a Little Gratitude!

With Earth Day fast approaching on April 22nd, our thoughts turn to caring for our planet. There are so many simple actions that can have a really big impact. By switching to a **reusable water bottle** you can help keep 150 or more plastic water bottles out of the ocean. **Composting** eggshells along with fruit and vegetable scraps reduces food waste in the landfill and helps to create nutrient-rich soil. And, switching from single-use plastic baggies to reusable silicone bags creates far less waste and, in the end, saves you money!

Two New Courses Available in April

Two five-week courses are being offered through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation (VLCFF) and the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston. These courses are hybrid models; they are composed of both weekly live two-hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through VLCFF. The courses are being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Office of Evangelization & Catechesis, who pays 100% of the tuition and the cost of any books associated with the courses.

Introduction to Prayer: Prayer is our means of taking a sighting, of re-orienting ourselves-by re-establishing contact with our goal. In the presence of God, many components of our life fall into perspective and our journey makes more sense. Prayer is inseparable from living (Casey, p.5). This course explores prayer as essential to our lives as Christian people, as individuals and within our community of faith. Through this course, students will explore the qualities, forms, and expressions of prayer that help to form and sustain our lives as Catholic Christians. We will look at prayer as revealed in Sacred Scripture, explore both personal and liturgical prayer, and examine the relation between prayer united with Jesus and discipleship. This course is part of the sequence in the level 1 catechist certification series. This is a hybrid course, which will include materials online and a twohour Zoom meeting once weekly on Wednesday evenings beginning on Wednesday April 10th at 7pm for five weeks.

Ecclesiology—Reframing the Church: This course is the third in the VLCFF Introductory ecclesiology sequence and continues to build the knowledge base for students about the Church. This course focuses primarily on the Church of Vatican II and how the Church is understood from the Council's teachings on liturgy, Scripture, structure, the role of the laity and its relation with the world. The ongoing Synod will also frame part of our conversation. This is a hybrid course, which will include materials online and a two-hour Zoom meeting once weekly on Monday evenings beginning on Monday April 8th at 7pm for five weeks.


