Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we hear the story of the Transfiquration. I believe one of the hardest things to describe is an encounter with the mystery of God's love, and it often happens in very ordinary ways. This past week our First Communion children prepared a meal for the homeless, and, as they were doing it, I remembered a lesson I learned from my mom. My mom is a cafeteria manager in a Catholic school, and every year she helps the children as young as kindergarten to prepare a meal that will be served at the local homeless Bartlett house. My mom tells the children as they make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches and spread the jelly to remember that they are making this sandwich for Jesus. The First Communion children helped make a very nice homemade meal for our brothers and sisters that are homeless. I told them they were doing this for Jesus as they pealed peanuts to make peanut butter balls. I watched them do this with such focus, prayerfulness, and joyfulness, and I realized we all have a lot to learn about the Eucharist from our First Communion children. The food that they fixed was made with an abundance of love; and what better of a witness of what the Eucharist we celebrate every Sunday is all about. As we made this meal, we did not travel to a mountain top like the disciples in the gospel, but it was certainly, like theirs, a transforming experience.

St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

For anyone seeking to conform themself more fully to Christ's infinitely compassionate heart, Melissa Harris-Perry's book, <u>Sister Citizen: Shame, Stereotypes and Black Women in America</u>, opens an important window into the lives of such persons who face unique and formidable challenges, as being not only female, but also black. Melissa Harris-Perry observes, "...black women in America have always had to wrestle with derogatory assumptions about their character and identity. These assumptions shape the social world that black women must accomodate or resist in an effort to preserve their authentic selves and to secure recognition as citizens. This is less a book about what black women do to become first-class American citizens than about how they feel while they are in that struggle."

Christ's ministry was always about "seeing" the unseen, recognizing and valuing the person before Him in spite of society's attempts to stereotype and ignore. This book shines compassionate light on a group of people in our midst who have been, and often still are, unseen and ignored, whose true value to our society goes unrecognized. There is a lot of valuable heart knowledge to learn from this book. Sister Citizen has been added to our St. Agnes Racial Justice Library in the church narthex.

Our Policy for Protecting Our Children


We follow the <u>Diocesan Safe Environment Program DWC</u> at St. Agnes. As of January 2023, all staff and volunteers 18 or older are required to complete the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston's Safe Environment program. The purpose of this program to increase awareness and provide a safe environment for the children of our parish and greater community. We do this to protect our children. The process is completely online now. There are directions available in the Narthex and the parish center for both creating a new Virtus account as well as directions available to help you log into your VIRTUS account if you already have an account.

Safe Environment Certification includes:

- 1. Virtus workshop Complete online training at www.virtusonline.org. Step-by-step instructions are available.
- Background Check Completing Screening One online application, part of the steps you will complete at www.virtusonline.org
- Diocesan Policy Reading the Diocesan Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children & completing the DWC Policy forms, also a step in the www.virtusononline.org process.



Gospel Weeklies

The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

Sunday's Gospel shows both Jesus' future and our own future. The Gospel sets our sight on Easter, just as Peter, James, and John glimpse the risen Jesus for a passing moment in the Transfiguration. Lent invites us to join Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem where he will be crucified, but also where he will rise victorious

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): This week's lesson helps children reflect on how they grow and change, and how nature around them is continually changing. Ask your child to recount how a caterpillar turns into a butterfly. Make it a practice to compliment your child every day for a way he or she is growing, especially in learning loving ways to act toward others.

Promise (Grades K-1): Lent is a time for growth in loving, sharing, and forgiving. Your child is learning how the world changes with the seasons and age. Talk to your child about what an adventure it is to grow as a loving person when we listen to Jesus. Praise your child when he or she shows love, sharing, or forgiveness.


Good News (Grades 2-3): Your child learned to recognize that Jesus is God's Son and learned how prayer is a way to change one's life. Ask your child to share with the family ways of praying—blessing, asking, thanksgiving, and praise. Discuss the meaning of the Transfiguration from the lesson. Talk about various ways your family prays together, and make a plan to try at least one new kind of prayer this week.

Venture (Grades 4-6): Your young person learned more about who Jesus is as told in Scripture. God's Son and our Savior gave a glimpse of who he is. Ask your child to tell the family in his or her own words about Queen Esther, Abraham and Sarah, and Saint Hilda of Whitby. Tell your child about his or her Baptism. Share why you decided to baptize your child, and about the promises you made at the Baptism.

Visions (Grades 7-9): Your youngster learned that, painful as it may be, change and transformation is possible. Ask your son or daughter to share the story "A.J.'s Secret" with the family. Talk about what A.J. learned from the experience, and how he received understanding and help by sharing his troubles. Talk about Jesus' Transfiguration on the mountain. What did this event show Peter, James, and John? What is the promise this event has for all of us? Share together what changes you would like to see in your family.

Pray Together

As a special devotion, try to have a brief family prayer each of the remaining days of Lent. Use a favorite family prayer, pray in your own words, or say one decade of the Rosary. Be sure to set a definite time for your daily prayer. Try to join in a morning prayer or an evening prayer together each day for a week. Begin and end your prayer times with the Sign of the Cross.





PARISH NURSING NEWS

March is National Kidney Month. According to the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney diseases, kidney disease is often called a "silent disease" because there are no symptoms during the early stages. It is important to protect your kidneys and take steps early to protect your kidneys from damage. If you are over 60, or have diabetes, high blood pressure or heart disease, you are more at risk for developing chronic kidney disease (CKD). Your primary care physician can test for kidney disease, or you may get sent to a nephrologist (kidney doctor). You can go to www.niddk.nih.gov and look up kidney disease for more information and tips. We will be checking blood pressures and blood sugars

after all Masses March 4 and 5.

Their menu includes from scratch pancakes, scrambled eggs, sausage, sausage gravy, bacon, applesauce, coffee, tea, and juice. The cost for adults is \$10 and \$5 for children age 4-12. There is free parking at meters on Saturdays, but residential parking rules remain in effect on Saturdays. The building is handicap accessible.

Recycling at St Agnes

We are trying to do a better job of caring for the Earth here at St Agnes. Toward that end, we have added recycling baskets at the church in the narthex and also at the parish center in Hendrix Hall. We are able to recycle paper, cardboard, plastic, and glass. It is important to note that paper and cardboard that are soiled with food cannot be recycled. Please throw those items in the trashcan. We use compostable utensils here at St Agnes. Compostable utensils, cups, and containers are not recy-

clable and should also be thrown away.

Don't forget that we work with Jim King to recycle glass here behind the parish center. Parishioners are welcome to bring their glass recycling from home and place it in the bin. It is helpful if glass items are placed in bags first and then into the bin.

We continue to find new ways to reduce, reuse, and recycle at St Agnes. We know we must live in communion with all living things, and we hope everyday to do just a little bit better!

EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.






