Dear Parishioners,

This past weekend I mentioned how shortly after Pope Francis was elected during the Easter season he reflected on how Our God is a God of surprises. This past weekend we experienced that when about 90 eighth graders along with their chaperones from Michigan who were on a field trip to Washington D.C. googled us on their way back home and joined us for our 8am Sunday Mass. This made for a wonderful Sunday celebration! We need to be open to these surprises that are often the work of the Lord. During the homily I mentioned that those who knew Abraham Lincoln noticed that throughout his life he was always curious. This curiosity or a sense of awe and wonder is what we are called, as followers of Jesus, to have. We never know when the God of Surprises will show up. I mentioned how an Episcopal pastor I am friends with asked one of his mentors once what ministry was all about. The young man mentioned the work of social justice, healing to the sick, proclaiming the gospel, and the sacraments. His mentor said all of these are important, but the most important thing is like a window to open the curtains and get lost in the fold; in a sense, to do all these things with a sense of awe and wonder. This reminded me of C.S. Lewis and his story, The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe, in which the plot is during World War II where a group of children discover a whole new world in the family closet. The Christian life calls us to recognize in the difficulties and tragedies of this world that a new world is intersecting. How this world and the world to come intersect is a mystery. We cannot fully see it, but on the Feast of Ascension we recognize that Jesus has passed over to it and pulls us towards it. Through the gift of the Spirit we are called to be sensitive, to be curious, and live lives that get lost in the folds of the mystery of God's love.

St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

We will soon be celebrating our nation's newest federal holiday, Juneteenth. Many are still unaware of what it is, and that it is now a federal holiday.

Juneteenth, a combination of "June" and "nineteenth," is the name for the oldest, ongoing celebration of the end of slavery in the United States, commemorating the day in 1865 in Galveston, Texas when U.S. Major General Gordon Granger issued General Order #3, finally informing the people of Texas, two plus years after the Emancipation Proclamation, that enslaved people were now and henceforth free. Southern states were slow to acknowledge federal authority after the end of the Civil War and stifled news of emancipation.

The news was celebrated in Galveston that day in 1865 and ever since. In 1872 a group of Black clergymen and businessmen bought 10 acres of land in Galveston that became Emancipation Park. Over a century later, on June 7, 1979 the Texas legislature passed a bill making Juneteenth a paid state holiday, the first state in the nation to do so.

President Biden signed the proclamation making it a federal holiday on June 18, 2021.

Here at St. Agnes, as disciples of the Jesus who devoted himself to all, especially the least among us, those on the margins of society, we will be raising awareness of this new federal holiday and its significance in the quest for racial justice, making sure we honor our country's commitment to the founding belief in the truth that all of us are created equal and endowed by our creator with certain unalienable rights.

We will be honoring the holiday at St. Agnes on the June 18th weekend. Stay tuned for more history here and notices of upcoming activities related to the holiday.

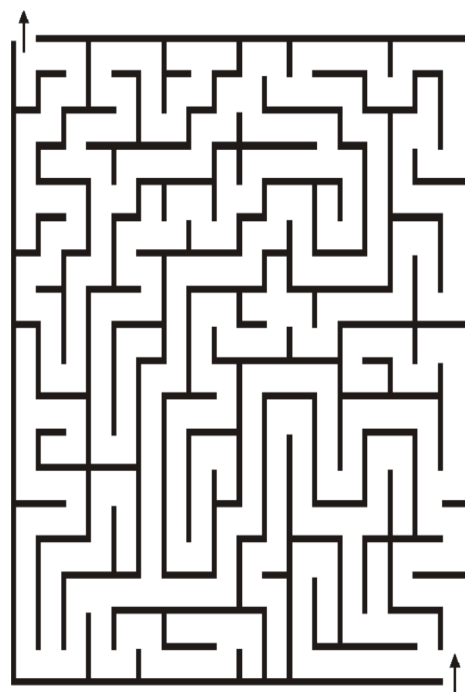

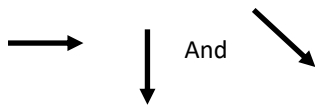

June 9, 10 and 11 and June 16, 17 and 18!

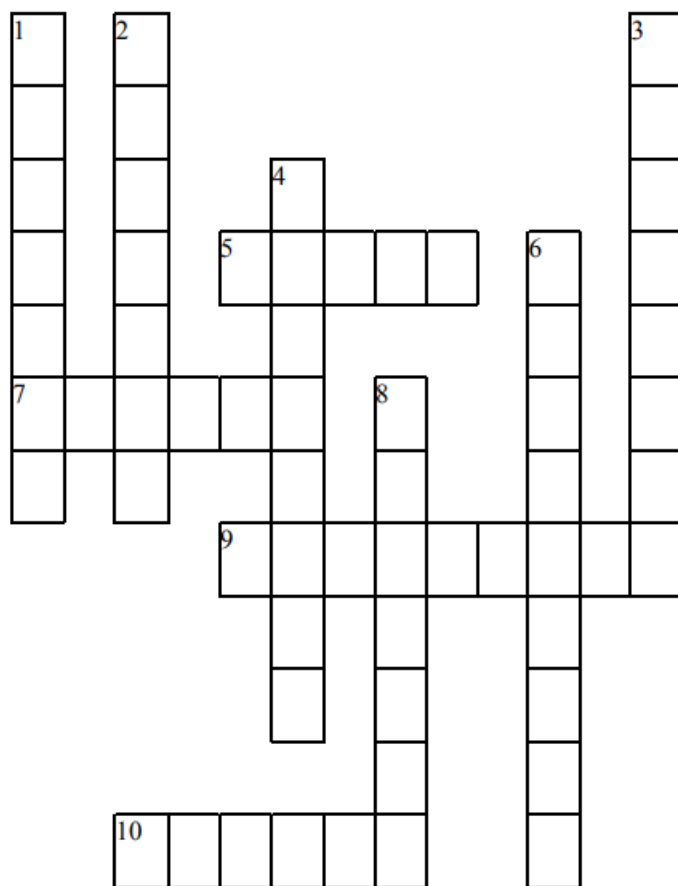
We are hoping to do **family movie nights** over the summer! Our goal would be outside under the stars. We are looking for a portable movie screen that we could borrow for the events!

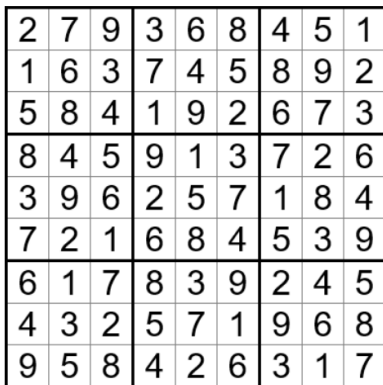

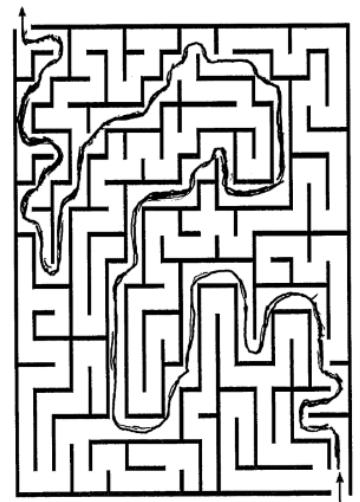

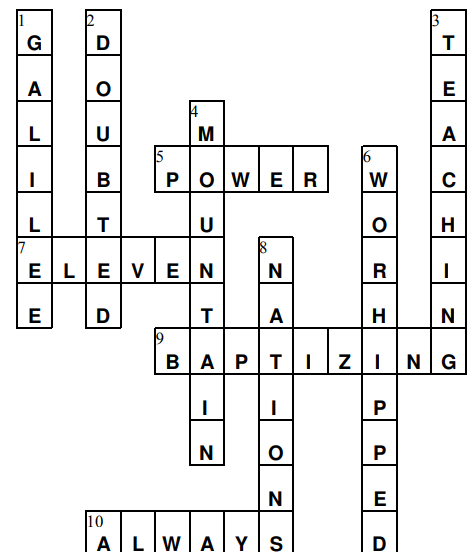
The Ascension of the Lord, Cycle A

New Course Offerings

Two five-week courses are being offered through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation (VLCFF). These courses are hybrid models. They are composed of both weekly live two-hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF). The courses are being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Office of Evangelization & Catechesis, who pays 100% of the tuition and the cost of any books associated with the courses. The Mass

In this course we will examine the core principles of the Eucharistic liturgy as found in the foundational documents of the Mass. We will consider its history and make connections between the modern liturgy and the historical context. Our central point of discussion throughout the course will be focused on the celebration of the Paschal Mystery. Over the course of the five weeks, we will take a deep dive into the elements of the Sunday celebration and its component parts. This course will be of value for liturgical ministers, RCIA Team members, and anyone interested in learning more about this most central celebration of all the baptized. All course materials are online, and we will meet for class lecture/discussion once a week on Tuesday evenings 7-9 pm beginning May 23rd

Images of Jesus

Through this course the participant will have the opportunity to examine, from a variety of theological perspectives, what we know and believe about the central figure of the Christian faith and arguably the most influential person who ever walked the earth. After looking at many different resources, the student will be able to form a personal answer to "Who do you say that I am?"

We will look at the images of Jesus in the New Testament, as understood in theology today, as understood in the Paschal Mystery and as encountered in the liturgical life of the Church. All course materials are online and we will meet for class lecture/discussion once a week on Wednesday evenings 7-9 pm beginning May 24th. This course is part of the sequence for the catechetical certification.

The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
