Dear Parishioners.

We sometimes call Pentecost the birthday of the church. On this Feast let's ask what new life is coming to birth in us as a community? This past week in Bible study, reflecting on the scriptures for the Feast of Pentecost, I asked the group, "how have you experienced the Holy Spirit in your life?" Every person shared a story of how, in a powerful way, they had an experience of the Holy Spirit like we read about today in the Acts of the Apostles. Throughout these 50 days from Easter to Pentecost, we, as a community, have been inviting members who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion for the first time to share with us what they experienced when they encountered the Lord. We need to hear as a community how God is at work and moving us, and Pope Francis' vision, listening to the faith of the people of God, is what Synodality is about. This is the earliest tradition of the church found in the Acts of Apostles.

This Feast teaches us that God loves diversity, and, in a world where diversity can lead to division, discrimination, and jealousy, at Pentecost God sees diversity as a gift. It is a gift that God has made us different, and unique and God has given us different gifts—not to compete against each other, but to complement each other and work together to serve and bring new life to all around us. As the Psalm said, "Lord send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth."

On the Feast of Pentecost in the preface for the Eucharistic Prayer, we as a community pray these powerful words, "For bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion you bestow the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children." This reminds us that we have been celebrating the death and resurrection of Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. This is our journey of faith, and it connects to our human journey at each stage. Fr Ronald Rolheiser I think puts it beautifully as he reflects on our journey from good Friday to Pentecost. He offers this advice: "Name your deaths. Claim your births. Mourn what you lost. Don't cling to what you had, but let it ascend. Receive a new spirit for the life you are already living." This, I believe, is what it means to walk the Paschal Mystery. May we honor the Paschal Mystery, wherever we are on that journey, recognizing that it takes a lifetime. Happy Pentecost!

St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

The new Juneteenth federal holiday actually encompasses a number of different dates on which emancipation was celebrated beginning in 1862-1865.

Two such celebration dates in various states, were September 22nd and January 1st, both related to Lincoln issuing the Emancipation Proclamation. The September date celebrated the day Lincoln issued the original proclamation after the Union victory at the battle of Antietam on September 17, 1862. The proclamation stated in part "that on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, all persons held as slaves within any State or designated part of a State, shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free..." January 1st celebrations marked the official implementation by President Lincoln's signature of the final version of the proclamation, which read in part, "this act, sincerely believed to be an act of justice, warranted by the Constitution, upon military necessity, I invoke the considerate judgement of mankind, and the gracious favor of Almighty God. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed. Done at the City of Washington, this first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the eighty-seventh." Spontaneous celebrations of the new freedom began immediately upon the news of the proclamation and have continued since.

In a time of continuing racial tension and increasing activity by hate groups, we at St. Agnes seek to deepen our commitment to racial justice. There is much more to accomplish. We will be sharing further news about our honoring the Juneteenth celebration on the June 18th weekend.

In our contemporary world, this judgment applies equally to other religions as well.







Family Connection

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation. As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting everyone to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or an issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting on how your family might address it. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:19–23. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's Psalm or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another a Sign of Peace.



To Report to Civil Authorities: Contact your local law enforcement; numbers will vary based on your location. If you believe someone is in immediate danger, call 911. To confidentially report any incidence of suspected child abuse or neglect, including sexual abuse, contact the West Virginia Bureau for Children and Families' Child Protective Services by calling the Child Abuse Hotline at 800.352.6513. To Report to Diocesan Authorities: In addition to civil authorities, the diocese encourages reporting to the appropriate church authorities. To report suspected cases of sexual abuse of children by personnel of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to the Diocese, contact one of the following designees at 1.888.434.6237 or 304.233.0880: Mr. Bryan Minor, ext. 263; Mr. Tim Bishop, ext. 353; or Very Rev. Dennis Schuelkens, Jr., V.E., ext. 270. You may also call the Diocese's Office of Safe Environment at 304.230.1504. In addition to the methods listed above for reporting sexual abuse, the Diocese also has partnered with Navex Global to offer the EthicsPoint platform to report other, additional concerns, such as suspected financial, professional, and personal misconduct of a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee of the Diocese or any Catholic parish or school in West Virginia. The EthicsPoint platform can be accessed via www.dwc.org, under "Accountability", then "Report Misconduct" or by calling 844.723.8381. EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.


