

Exciting News! We are expanding the garden space at the parish center and rectory at St Agnes in partnership with the Ranson Community Gardens. We are welcoming community members of all ages to participate, any level of ability and interest will be nurtured and appreciated. Ideally we will have participants form teams, each team will be responsible for one raised bed. We already have one scouting troop interested in participating, and we are inviting those affiliated with groups of all ages to let us know of their interest in such a community endeavor. Please help us spread the word beyond our St Agnes borders. This is an ecumenical project!

The raised beds were prepared for planting on April 22; a small group of volunteers, including Fr Andy, came together to erect and fill the new raised beds. On May 14 following the 10:30am Mass, we will gather at the gardens and have our opening event, at which time Fr Andy will get us started with a blessing and we will be planting seeds and plants that have been started in pots. We will be sharing this information with the media in a forum not yet determined.

Do not let limited mobility stop you from joining us. We have two raised beds that are 3 feet tall that will accommodate people who need to work from a higher level.

Produce raised in this community garden will be donated to the local food bank and others in the community. We will also have a flower garden.







The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: John 14:1-12

Jesus directs us to not let our hearts be troubled. Our faith in Jesus can keep us filled with God's peace. In this week's Gospel, Jesus promises that he is preparing a place for each of us in heaven. We will get there through following Jesus, who is the way, the truth, and the life. As Jesus tells his Apostles, whoever has seen him has seen the Father.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Your child concluded this week that Jesus is not just someone we follow, but also a friend. Talk with your child about how we follow Jesus. Then discuss how Jesus is our friend. Consider placing the drawing your child did in class in a prominent place. Each time you see it, repeat the message from Jesus.

Promise (Grades K-1): Your child created a church from cutouts in the lesson. Take a look at it together, then talk about how your own church is set up. How are the pews lined up? What does the art look like? Is there stained glass? Describe the altar and other special areas of the church.

Good News (Grades 2-3): Your child learned about Jesus' Way. He healed people. He made friends, and he taught people how to live a holy life. Ask your child what happens when we receive the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Explain how you understand the Holy Spirit's action in your life. How does your family share Jesus' Good News in the world?


Venture daughter how Chief Seattle's quote describes our relationship with God and each other. In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that whoever believes in him will do his work on Earth. Discuss ways that you already do this and talk about how you might do even greater things. A discussion about things that your child worries about may be timely this week as Jesus tells his friends to have faith to calm their troubled hearts. Talk about how the Second Vatican Council opened the Church to the modern world. Is there anyone in your family who remembers the time before the Council?


Visions (Grades 7-9): Your youngster discussed the work that Christians do. Talk about how your son or daughter does that work today. Jesus says in the Gospel this week that he is going to prepare a place for each of us in heaven. Make sure your young person understands how to get there through Jesus. Ask your youngster why we are all "living stones." What ministries are members of your family involved with, and what are some that you might consider exploring? Adopt the Living Stones Prayer Service for home this week.


Pray Together

Fast Fashion and Laudato Si

Fast fashion has completely revolutionized the apparel industry, but not for the better. Behind every piece of clothing in a store, there is an industry stripping the Earth of its limited resources and exploiting the labor force that works in its garment factories. Tremendous waste characterizes this industry as it depletes healthy soil, contaminates fresh water sources, pollutes the air we breathe, defiles our oceans, destroys forests and damages ecosystems and the health of their biodiversity.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Consumers have the power to change the trajectory of fast fashion. Here are a few important things you can do:

- Educate yourself about sustainable clothing.
- Buy less and shop for quality over quantity.
- Choose natural materials organic cotton, linen, or hemp.
- Buy 100% recycled fabrics 100% recycled polyester, viscose (rayon), etc.
- Research brands to identify those that are ethical and practice transparency and sustainability.
- Post a picture of yourself wearing a sustainable garment, explaining its attributes and why you like it.
- Choose brands that are manufactured in their own community and connected to the place, people behind them, local economy, and environment.
- Buy secondhand clothing.
- Swap clothes with a clothes swap group or start a swap yourself.
- Learn how to repair your clothes yourself. The longer clothes are kept, the lower their emissions footprint.

St Agnes Racial Justice Initiative News

The initial comments of the Texas governor on the recent mass shooting of five people in Cleveland, TX on April 28th deserve to be noted by anyone concerned about social and racial justice in our country. While not uttering the usual "thoughts and prayers" for the victims and their families, he felt the need to point out on Twitter the immigrant status of the victims, labeling them as "illegal immigrants." This is perhaps a not so subtle dog-whistle that the victims of this shooting are not as worthy of our sympathy and compassion as others might be. His casually gratuitous, unnecessary mention of their legal status should disturb us all, whether intentional or simply cluelessly insensitive. Either way his remark points a way down a disturbing path that implies some humans are more God's children than others.

Needless to say, he was called out by other elected officials and representatives of Latino organizations, among others. His only "apology" was to say he got some inaccurate information about the victims that did not reflect the apparent legal status of at least one of the victims - not addressing the racial overtones of his comments.

These victims of a mass gun shooting with an AR-15, including a nine year old child and two mothers, who died using their bodies as shields to save their children, deserve better from those who speak on our behalf in government. The victims fled the ravages of gang violence riddled Honduras, only to have this happen to them here in America.

As Christians we need to make our voices heard.


