Reflections on Carmelite Spirituality

Reflections on Carmelite Spirituality

He has been a member of the Discalced Carmelite Secular Order since 1972.

At noon on Sunday, December 15, Dr. Sengers will be sharing his decades of experience in Carmelite prayer and contemplation. The Season of Advent is the perfect time for reflection and growth in our relationship with God and one another.

Dear Parishioners,

This week we will celebrate two feast days honoring the Virgin Mary. On Monday evening, December 9, at 7 o'clock, we will gather to celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. Even as this feast focuses upon Mary's conception in her mother's womb, we praise God for the hope that she embodies for all of us. What can we learn from this first and most important relationship Jesus experienced within humanity? The relationship between a mother and child is indeed something profound and sacred. At the end of his earthly life, Jesus entrusted his mother to the care of the apostle John and thus began an intimate relationship between Mary and we human folks.

Even though the obligation to celebrate Mass has been lifted this year, please come and join us for Mass. This is also the Patronal Feast-day of the United States of America, an opportunity to pray for our nation and national leaders.

The second feast honoring Mary this week is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Thursday, December 12. Our Mexican brothers and sisters cry *Viva la Virgen!* Mary appeared to Juan Diego in 1531 and brought more clearly into sight, God's desire to visit and dwell with people of every time and race. Even though we do not have a scheduled Mass on this day, we can each remember and ponder the gift of Mary, the gift of Jesus in our midst! We can also pray for our Mexican brothers and sisters.

On Saturday afternoon, we will gather at 4 o'clock and celebrate our Advent Communal Reconciliation. In this season of preparation, Jesus invites us to prepare for his Kingdom by letting go of negative patterns of behavior—to *forgive and to let ourselves be forgiven*—to give into new ways of living. By letting go and forgiving, we are able to participate in a deeper relationship with God and with one another.

We will have two visiting priests to help assist with the celebration, Fr. Bob Keffer and Fr. Pius from the VAMC. Do make an effort to come and open your heart to God's grace, love, and peace.

Social Concerns Weekend

December 7 & 8, 2019

There is lots happening this Social Concerns Weekend. All wrapped gifts for the Gift Tag project are due by noon on Sunday, December 8. If you take a tag or two or more, please return the gifts by then. Otherwise, Social Concerns members need to shop for the gifts that afternoon using funds we usually use for other purposes. We don't want anyone on our gift tag list to be disappointed. We'll be collecting funds to feed the hungry and homeless and also collecting new socks, hats, scarves and gloves. Youth and parishioners will be serving the meal on Christmas Day. We'd like to be able to offer warm clothing as well as great food. Please bring donations to church or drop off donations at the Parish Center. There is a basket in the entry.

We received word that Eastern Panhandle Empowerment Center, EPEC (formerly Shenandoah Women's Center) has a desperate need for women's winter coats. You can drop off women's coats at the office on Martin St. M-F from 9 – 4, or leave them at the parish center and someone will take them to EPEC. We'll be accepting donations for feminine hygiene products for EPEC as well.

The Little Brothers and Sisters of the Incarnation are native Haitian religious orders working primarily in the Upper Plateau in Haiti and also operating orphanages in Port Au Prince. This is a report this week from an American associate in close communication with them. "One of the sisters from Saintard, together with the chauffeur and another person were hijacked when they ventured out for provisions a week ago and the truck was seized and burned right there on the street. The three were robbed, the provisions burned with the truck, but thankfully no one was physically harmed. At the moment, the roads in and out of the capital are all blocked, "bandits" are present everywhere and kidnapping and extortion are popular money-making propositions... Brother 'X' and two companions were stopped multiple times on a former 2 ½ hour trip to the Central Plateau area which cost them \$1,000 in impromptu 'tolls' and 8 hours of additional 'travel time.'"

Needless to say, the financial losses to these religious orders are a substantial setback but the continuing danger to them physically and to those they serve is even more critical.

A Christmas gift suggestion: We can't personally do anything to help the political situation but purchasing the Fair Trade Just Haiti coffee we will be selling helps the farmers with much needed income during this crisis – and it is good coffee! On Feb. 2, 2020, Kim Lamberty, founder and president of Just Haiti, Inc. will be speaking after the 10:30 Mass. Mark your calendars!
