Dear Parishioners,

I work with veterans who struggle with anxiety, depression, racing thoughts, and general unease within that affects their daily living. An important part of treatment is teaching them how to once again become comfortable with themselves. Along with many other techniques, *mindfulness* is an approach that comes from the Eastern tradition while *contemplation* comes from our Judeo-Christian tradition.

The gospel lesson from Luke's account, brings us into a situation that might well be familiar to each of us. Martha and Mary seem to have quite different temperaments, as they share their home with Jesus. There is obviously a friendship, as Martha does not hesitate to voice her frustration to Jesus. Over-anxious about getting things done, Jesus responds to Martha urging her to step back and take a few minutes. Jesus seems to stand with Mary, but he is not dismissing the important work that Martha presently finds overwhelming. Perhaps we have each been there, from time to time.

Psychotherapist Thomas Moore says, "There is no doubt but that some people could spare themselves the expense and trouble of psychotherapy simply by giving themselves a few minutes each day

for quiet reflection. This simple act would provide what is missing in their lives—a period of non-doing that is essential nourishment to the soul."

Contemplation is what calms the mind and the body in order to enter the presence of God. Awareness of the presence of God cannot happen if our prayer is filled with words, even scriptural words, that never end. Simply sitting before the face of God, in the presence of Jesus, will wrap us in the presence of God. Ultimately, prayer is not about words but about communion with God. Prayer is resting in the presence of God. It is more a question of staying quiet in his presence than of saying prayers (Anthony Bloom).

## "Simple Acts to Save Our Planet"

Carry nutritious bird food. When ducks, geese, swans, and other water fowl ingest a diet too high in protein or carbohydrates, they can develop a very serious condition that has been dubbed "angel wing." The disorder causes the last joint in one or both wings to unnaturally twist outward, rather than lying flat against the bird's body. You can still bond with water fowl, but instead feed them the right food to sustain their health. Nutritious waterfowl feed and duck pellets are both inexpensive and easy to carry. You could also feed waterfowl seedless grapes cut in half; shredded kale, swiss chard, or romaine lettuce; and grains, including wheat, barley, and oats. Properly feeding birds will also help children understand how to compassionately coexist with wildlife.
