A Church Perspective on the Intractable Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

Based upon his experience working with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, the local Church in the Holy Land, and the Vatican, Stephen Colecchi will explore the longstanding Israeli-Palestinian conflict and critique current U.S. Middle East policy.

Bio:

Stephen Colecchi is the former director of the Office of International Justice and Peace of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, coordinating overall staff support to the bishops on a full range of international issues. He specialized in concerns related to the Middle East and global issues related to nuclear weapons, war and peace.

Steve holds a B.A. from Holy Cross College, an M.A. from Yale University, and a D. Min. from St. Mary's in Baltimore. He is the author of two books: a Guide to Sharing Catholic Social Teaching and In the Footsteps of Jesus: Resource Manual on Catholic Social Teaching.

Social Concerns Weekend August 3 & 4, 2019

Cold Weather Shelter Update

Summary of Meeting at Saint Agnes with Jefferson County Community Ministries Director Robert Shefner and parishioners interested in information on Jefferson County Cold Weather Shelter Program:

Bob opened with background on history of the program, the churches currently involved as venues and what responsibilities volunteers would have if they undertake to help. There was a detailed discussion about problems inherent in such an undertaking but the support system from JCCM is already immediately ready to help. Bob further stressed that it is a "life changing" experience and that the community members who use the shelter are both appreciative and helpful. There were approximately 30 people who attended.

Saint Agnes participant questions included:

Total number of people needed to run the program, number on duty on any given shelter night, condition of the facility and cleanup after use, transportation and any food service that may be provided by hosts.

The question was also discussed about combining forces with existing shelters in the Shepherdstown area as a starting point before committing Saint Agnes as a venue. Further questions were about emergency situations that might occur on any given night and Bob recited situations that had actually happened and how they were addressed. He emphasized that the shelter manager was available at all times to assist if the circumstances seemed to much for the volunteers to handle. It was stressed that last year there were over 80 community members who were candidates for the shelter but the state fire marshal limits occupancy to 16 people per night. The question was raised about opening more than one shelter per night and it was agreed there are not enough volunteers to handle that right now. One experienced volunteer said he thought at least 60 participating people were necessary to guarantee success for the program at Saint Agnes. He related problems by the Shepherdstown Presbyterian coordinator in providing two nightly volunteers in any weekly term. This led to the thought that a consortium of Shepherdstown churches might bring us up to that number and supporting Asbury and SPC would be the best way to enter the program and provide experience.

Actions discussed included using Saint Agnes as a venue and what those responsibilities entail, i.e. insurance, fire protection, EMT contacts where necessary, transportation, support from JCCM staff and followup presentation with JCCM staff to focus on duties and responsibilities of volunteers.

We are working with Jan Jordan, the shelter manager, and will offer an hour of instruction for those considering volunteering on August 21, 2019, from 7 to 8 PM at Jefferson County Community Ministries, 238 West Washington Street, Charles Town, WV, 25414.
