This funding is far more than the diocese contributes to CCHD.

Dear Parishioners,

This is a time in our history where it is certainly easy to be cynical. We face so many challenges as a country and a world. I was grateful to a parishioner who let me know that in Assisi Pope Francis was meeting with young entrepreneurs, economists, and leaders to seek a better future, an economy that lifts up everyone especially the poor and vulnerable. This reminded me to not just look at the problems, but to seek solutions for what we are facing today. I was truly inspired by these young adult leaders. They give me great hope for our future. I am reminded of the words from Bobby Kennedy, "Some people look at things as they are and ask why, I dream dreams that never were and ask why not.." May we dream a better future for humanity. I believe it is always important as pastor to dialogue with folks in the pews to get a pulse on where people are at and how to best minister. Reflecting on Matthew 25 and Francis' gathering of young adults, here is a summary of notes from their discussion that a parishioner put together that I believe is worth our consideration.

*This Sunday's Gospel is so well known in the Christian community and beyond. It expresses the very heart and spirit of discipleship: **Relationship** to God unfolds in care for the needy among us. That is truly a faith-filled loving kindness as personified in Jesus Christ. Those clearly stated parts of relationships in today's Gospel get right to the essentials of **caring relationships** -- these embrace the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger,*

*the naked, the sick, and the imprisoned because their well-being is tied to our well-being. We are forever **responsible together** for building up and co-creating the goodness at the heart of life from beginning to end, including everyone, sharing with everyone, welcoming the least among us to the table of plenty. That faith-filled measure is tied to justice, the logic of love overriding the diminished goals of individualistic concerns.*

In today's fragmented and sorely challenged world, the Gospel message speaks to the nations, to collective humanity, and to each part of the greater community by showing the way of our caring God towards all our brokenness. In the same vein, Pope Francis chose these last few days of the liturgical year to listen to young leaders from across the world about their vision for a more just economic order for all peoples. He had asked in 2019 for economists and young people to work with the need for a different kind of economy, one that is more attentive to the weakest members of society and is not focused exclusively on the gain of material wealth. What better way to be thankful, to be grateful for all who inspire us in caring for each other, for our global community and Common Home as we follow in the footsteps of Jesus, St Francis, Pope Francis and all our own St Agnes supporting and caring sisters and brothers...

Music Notes

For November, when we especially remember those who have died, I thought I'd put together some favorite music and writings that have comforted me by way of the arts. Let's begin with a writing by German Jesuit, Karl Rahner, considered one of the most influential Catholic theologians of the 20th century. He wrote for (or intended to) ordinary Christians. Here is a selection on death.... *The great and sad mistake of many people – among them even pious persons – is to imagine that those whom death has taken, leave us. They do not leave us... They remain! Where are they? In darkness? Oh no! It is we who are in darkness. We do not see them, but they see us. Their eyes, radiant with glory, are fixed on our eyes full with tears. Oh, infinite consolation! Though invisible to us, our dead are not absent. I have often reflected upon the surest comfort for those who mourn. It is a firm faith in the real and continual presence of our loved ones; it is the clear and penetrating conviction that death has not destroyed them, nor carried them away. They are not even absent, but living near to us, transfigured: having lost, in their glorious change, no delicacy of their souls, no tenderness of their hearts, no special preference in their affection. On the contrary, they have, in depth and in fervour of devotion, grown large, a hundredfold. Death is,*

for the good, a translation into light, into power, into love. Those who on earth were only ordinary Christians become perfect; those who were good become sublime. (On the Theology of Death, Karl Rahner, Herder and Herder, 1965.)

After reading this, may I suggest that you listen and watch a half-hour of glorious music and visual art: The Duruflé Requiem, Op. 9: A Prayer for Our Planet. <https://vimeo.com/218763696>.

The composer has set the Gregorian chant requiem Mass text and music in luxurious harmonies creating a unique masterpiece. This particular YOUTUBE version is accompanied with glorious film of nature and our planet. Some in our community remember the chant funeral Mass from childhood. Others sang it with Shepherd University several years ago.

Survey of Catholic Doctrine

Survey of Catholic Doctrine (January 3 – February 6)

Giving Tuesday donations will not be assessed the normal 9% "tax" that the diocese assesses on normal contributions made to St. Agnes.

Although online donations are the primary way of making donations to St. Agnes for this, you are not required to do it online. **You can donate with a check or cash** by putting it in an envelope in the weekend collection basket, mailing it to the office, or dropping it off at the office. Just **make the checks payable to St. Agnes and indicate that it is for "Giving Tuesday"** so that we can notify the diocese of your non-assessable donation. Be sure to note on the check and/or envelope that this is for "Giving Tuesday." **It is important that these are delivered to the office on or before December 1.**

As you may be aware, 2020 has been a difficult year. St. Agnes parishioners have been extremely generous in continuing to support St. Agnes during these challenging times. We plan to use the funds donated through this program to help make up the gap between our income and expenses exacerbated by the pandemic. Thank you for all that you have done for St. Agnes in 2020!

Social Concerns Weekend December 5 & 6

This is the last Social Concerns Weekend of a very challenging year. Many thanks to all of you who have supported our parishioners' efforts to feed the homeless, provide feminine hygiene products, purchase LOTS of sleeping bags as well as contribute to the migrant ministry kits and school backpacks and supplies (mainly handled by our KofC), and most recently contribute so generously to our greatly revised Advent Gift Tag Project!

The numbers of people seeking an evening meal has increased over 25% in the last few months – even more if the children are included. Now people have to stay outdoors to receive and eat their meals, and still they come. We have increased the amount we give our parish volunteers who prepare meals to \$150 but that doesn't cover the cost of the meals frequently. We are in great need of people to prepare meals and of volunteers to deliver the meals.
