Pastoral Council Responds to Amended Plan for Bishop Bransfield

You are invited to sign Letters of Endorsement

With much thought, prayer and discernment the Pastoral Council has sent letters to Cardinal Ouellet, Prefect for the Congregation of Bishops, Papal Nuncio, Archbishop Pierre, Bishop Mark Brennan, Diocese Wheeling-Charleston, and Bishop Bransfield (via Bishop Brennan and Archbishop Pierre) to address our thoughts, concerns and continued questions related to the recent Congregation of Bishops' decision on the amended plan for Bishop Bransfield.

Copies of the letters are on the St. Agnes Website, at the Parish Center, and will be in the Church on the first two weekends in October. If after reading the letters you wish to endorse our letters, you may sign at the Church before or following the Saturday 5:30 Mass on October 3rd and October 10th or the Sunday 10:30 Mass on October 4th and October 11th. You can also sign at the Parish Center from October 5th through October 16th.

Sacraments Course

This five week course (October 18-November 21) will look at the history and theology of the sacraments. Beginning with a look at the Liturgy we will then explore Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation (the sacraments of Initiation). We will then look at the sacraments of healing, that is, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Sacrament of the Sick. Finally, we will examine the sacraments of communion, also known as the Sacrament of Marriage and the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

If you are a catechist or work with the RCIA, couples preparing for marriage, or parents preparing to baptize their children, or are an adult interested in deepening your faith, please join fellow Catholics from across the Diocese as we learn more about our Tradition.

This course is a hybrid model. It is composed of both weekly live two hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF)

This course is being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston who pays 100% of the tuition

Migrant Worker Kit Results

St. Agnes Council #13887 of the Knights of Columbus, in Shepherdstown, WV, has once again donated hygiene kits to support an outreach program of *Shenandoah Community Health* that provides services to migrant workers and the homeless. To quote their website, "Shenandoah Community Health's Special Populations Department has over 45 years of combined experience coordinating visits to migrant camps and sites where the homeless gather. [their] outreach team consists of nurses, bilingual outreach workers, and drivers who support this high risk and under-served population." They ensure access to health care at 28 migrant camps located throughout Berkeley, Jefferson, and Morgan Counties in West Virginia, as well as other places in this region.

As part of their outreach they provide hygiene kits. These contain essential toiletries such as toothpaste and brush, razors and shaving soap, bath soap, bath towel and wash cloth, and deodorant. This year bandannas and masks were included. Through the generosity of the parishioners at St. Agnes Catholic Church, and the efforts of members of St. Agnes Council, 100 kits were assembled and delivered to Shenandoah Community Health. These kits contained materials valued in excess of \$1,000. Special thanks go to Martin's Food Store in Charles Town for supplying 100 durable, reusable shopping bags that contain the kits.

Migrant workers form a critical element in harvesting the agricultural bounty of this region. It's gratifying to be able to supply some of their needs in this land of plenty.

CCWVa Serving Thru Pandemic

The Martinsburg Catholic Charities office has continued to serve the community throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to meet the increased demand for assistance due to the economic impact the pandemic has had on working families, the staff applied for and received numerous grants. Since evictions and utility terminations were put on hold for several months, the staff also made a commitment to help families who couldn't pay their bills whether or not they had received eviction or termination notices. All of this resulted in a significant spike in the amount of assistance provided to residents of Berkeley, Jefferson, and Morgan Counties.

From March 1 – September 30, 2019, the office provided \$14, 715.99 in assistance. In comparison, from March - September 30, 2020, the office provided \$31,381.53 in assistance. The greatest need has been to help ensure people are housed. During those seven months in 2019, the Martinsburg office provided \$4,013.60 in housing assistance. To date in 2020, it provided \$20,366.18 in housing assistance. Many of the individuals helped have lost income because of the pandemic. As of October 1, electric terminations will begin again.

As we go into the fall and winter, most of the grant funds have been expended, but the need continues to grow. Unemployment is backlogged and people in our community are suffering deeply. We are doing our best to keep individuals and families whole and can continue to do so with your support. All monetary donations stay within our local community to provide direct assistance for our clients and their wellbeing. A Time of Not Forgetting

After the ravages of World War II, the will to hold on to peace and stability brought forth a new organization, the *United Nations*, which in 2020 celebrates its 75th anniversary. Countless millions of lives were lost during the horrific conflicts which fueled unimaginable bloodshed.

Let the world unite and let solidarity overcome the propensity to violence: Such, indeed, is the hope symbolized in the ongoing cooperative efforts of the United Nations – “a sign of unity between States and an instrument of service to the entire human family” in the words of Pope Francis’ address to the institution last week.

The crisis that grips the world right now has claimed over 1 million lives. Covid19 has awoken us to our common vulnerability, our interconnectedness, and to the critical understanding that **the future rests on mutual recognition and solidarity**. As Pope Francis puts it, the UN should be used to “transform the challenge that lies before us into an opportunity to build together, once more, the future we all desire.” We eagerly await the new encyclical which he signs in Assisi this Sunday. His words matter to all our hopes for the shape of next efforts and political will to organize our world more justly.

As we mourn those who are dying from Covid19 and from the inflicted hardships of those who wield power without ethical concern, let us join St Francis this weekend, anniversary of his death, through the prayer of the ***Canticle of the Creatures***. The final verses were added by him as he lay dying:

“Praised be you, my Lord, for our Sister,
Bodily Death, from whom no one living can escape . . .”

*Concerned memory, care filled love, and the wisdom of
living and dying before our gracious God...*
