

Mass at St. Agnes

This past weekend we had 46 people present for the 5:30pm Mass and 44 individuals in attendance for the 10:30am Mass. These numbers include those who chose to sit outside for Mass as we continue to have a limit of 50 inside the church. There were 5 present for the recording of the Sunday video Mass, and, as far as we know, there were 102 who tuned into the video Mass.

Online Mass Reservations

Simply select your Mass and tell us who you are and how many will be attending. To assist those who find the online reservations challenging, our thoughtful tech volunteers have put together a brief **"How to reserve a seat for Mass" video** to help guide you through the process. The video can be found both on our website under "parish news and events" in the New Tutorial *Attending Mass During Pandemic* as well as on the Eventbrite website where you actually make your reservation. If you have any problems using the online system, feel free to call the office by 3pm on Friday, and we will make the reservation for you.

Keep in mind, there is a limit of 50 people at each Mass, masks are required, and social distancing must be observed.

No Ordinary Time No Ordinary Homeland

In a few weeks' time, we celebrate and remember the life and message of the Poor Man of Assisi, the Poverello, whose story remains a perennial call to behold the goodness of all creation. His was no ordinary time: Battles raged between rival provinces; religions waged crusading wars for domination of souls and thrones; devastating disease and want ravaged the streets of the newly emerging cities; encrusted institutionalism behind imperial enclosures blinded much of the Church leadership to the urgent challenges of changing times. Francis walks out among the people in tatters, befriends the disease-ridden, embraces the beauty of Lady Poverty, dialogues with Brother Sun and Sister Moon -- all of whom opened his eyes to God-among-us in the humility of the manger, and far away from the presumptive power of thrones and courts of passing glory.

800 years later, there is an eerie similarity to our time. We have pushed the boundaries beyond regional cities to planetary proportions; we are watching equally planetary devastation and the scars of disease, systemic racism and sexism, and the plagues of blind quest for domination of the spirit and souls of others, most especially, of those ousted from their homelands and left begging for survival out on the high seas, the refugee camps, or at the mercy of labor bosses in mass industrial production chains, rather than in decent human conditions of labor...

During this coming week, we are invited to re-think the life of Francis and be inspired by his humble and extraordinary example which faced the challenge of change at a time like our own: **No ordinary time** to be accountable as Catholic and Christian, putting love of God, love of our sisters and brothers within our shared common home above all else.

"We exist only in relationships: with God the creator, with our brothers and sisters as members of a common family and with all of God's creatures within our common home." *Pope Francis, 2020.*

Of further interest to us, during the Season of Creation, is quite an extraordinary witness to our understanding of Plant Earth: **David Attenborough: A Life On Our Planet.** It is a powerful first-hand account of humanity's impact on nature and a message of hope for future generations.

In his 94 years, Attenborough has visited every continent on the globe, documenting the living world in all its variety and wonder. Now, for the first time he reflects upon both the defining moments of his lifetime as a naturalist and the devastating changes he has seen. It is, he tells us, **"my witness statement and my vision of the future. We need to learn how to work with Nature rather than against it."**

The documentary premieres in European cinemas on this September 28th and will be available soon after on Netflix.

Election 2020

Reminder - although the West Virginia election rules say you have until October 28 to request an absentee ballot, it also says these ballots must be received six days before election day, i.e., October 28. If you choose to vote via absentee, we strongly encourage you to request your ballot soon. They will begin mailing ballots to voters on September 17th. See instructions below on how to request an absentee ballot and how to complete the ballot when it is received.

Voting by Mail – Step 1 - Request an absentee ballot

If you would like to vote via mail, you need to first request an absentee ballot. You can do this in several ways:

Online - You can request on-line that a form be mailed to you by going to your County Clerk or Board of Elections website.

For West Virginia: <https://sos.wv.gov/elections/Pages/GoVoteWV.aspx>.

For Maryland: <https://elections.maryland.gov/voting/absentee.html>.

Call – You can call your County Clerk or Elections office and ask them to mail you the absentee ballot request form. (Jefferson – (304)-728-3215, Berkeley - (304) 264-1927), Washington County, MD – (240) 313-2050

Print your own - You can download the absentee application form from your County Clerk/BOE website. Once you've completed the form, it can be returned via mail, fax, or email to your County Clerk's office.

Pick up and send - You can also obtain a copy of the form from St. Agnes (please call ahead of time) or the Shepherdstown public library, either of whom will fax or scan it and email it for you for free.

Note: You must choose a reason for requesting an absentee ballot. For most of us locally, the reason will be for "medical reasons/Covid". Just being anxious about COVID is a sufficient medical reason to vote absentee. You do not have to be sick with COVID.

Voting by Mail - Step 2 – Completing and returning your ballot

Instructions to complete the ballot:

Marking your Ballot:

Mark your ballot with a pen. Follow the instructions on your ballot, which will tell you to mark your choices clearly with an "X" or fill in the oval with blue or black ink.

The instructions below the title of each office on the ballot will tell you how many people you may choose for that office.

When you finish marking your ballot:

Fold your ballot, place it in the envelope marked No. 1, and seal the envelope. Note: Do not remove the stub from your ballot.

Place the sealed envelope No. 1 (containing your ballot) inside of envelope marked No. 2 and seal envelope No. 2.

Complete and sign envelope No. 2, titled "Voter, complete this form"

Return your ballot to your county clerk's office as soon as possible. You can mail it (be sure you have the correct postage), drop it off at the County Clerks office or have someone at St. Agnes deliver it for you.

What if I make a mistake on my ballot?

If you make a mistake in your selection, cross out both the mark and the candidate or issue, and mark your choice.

If your ballot is destroyed or you cannot correct your mistakes, you should immediately contact your county clerk for instructions on receiving a replacement ballot.

Deadlines for returning your ballot (must be received in the county clerk's office by these deadlines):

By mail: by the close of polls on election day

By mail without postmark: the day after the election

By mail postmarked by the US Postal Service by Election Day: the start of canvass (five days after the election, excluding Sundays)

Hand-delivered (a person may deliver no more than two absentee ballots): the day before the election

St Joe's Fundraising

Box Tops for Education

St Joe's School is once again participating in the Box Tops for Education program. Clipped box tops, which are rare these days, can be dropped off at the school.

Now, they primarily are collected through the app, with which you scan receipts from stores. The school is listed as St Joseph School [TA/PTO]; you can search for it by that name or by location (Martinsburg, WV).

Some basics:

- The app is available for android or iPhone. If you do curbside pickup for your groceries, make sure the email you use to set up your account for the app is the same as the email address that you use for curbside. The app allows friends and family who would normally have to mail you their box tops to just scan their receipts. Get family, friends and co-workers involved!
- If you don't have a smartphone or do not want to scan your receipts, you can drop your grocery receipts off at the school and the school coordinator will scan them. Receipts are good for 14 days. You can scan up to 50 in a day.
- If you do curbside pickup or online orders, when you get the email with your order, forward it to receipts@boxtops4education using the same email that is associated with the app. It takes up to 10 business days for it to be credited to your account. It will show up in the MY EARNINGS section of the app.
