Dear Parishioners,

These are certainly, I believe, challenging times we are living in. The difficulty of a pandemic, the economic struggle many are facing, the division in our country, the reality of racism, and the list could go on. The Christian is called to make Jesus' message a reality. Jesus' message of the kingdom that we take up calls us to be about the message of love, healing, peace, equality, and justice. How do we embody that message? This is done by God's grace when we become more aware of how much God loves us. This is the goal of prayer, to make ourselves aware of that love that God has for each of us in a unique way and to share that love with others. I bring this up because I think in these turbulent times it is only as we become more aware that God walks with us through the turmoil and storms that we can respond the way we were called to. Recently in a COVID-19 safe way we had a youth gathering, and the youth cleaned the trail that has our Stations of the Cross. After we finished I asked them each to name both a high and a low that they have experienced during the last several months of the pandemic. There were many lows as all of us have, but one high that was consistent that they mentioned was that because they had to slow down during the pandemic they actually got to know their own family better and grew closer. I told the youth that as they shared both their highs and lows that they really professed what we believe as Catholics; that God's love walks with us in the Good Friday's, but also how they could see how, even in these difficult times, they experienced some of Easter; we call this the paschal mystery.

The youth seemed to be aware that as a Christian community we are called to slow down, to be more sensitive to the needs of those around us, to be aware that as community we are responsible for each other, to learn to live in tune with our environment. As Pope Francis emphasizes, this earth is our common home, and how we should live in a more communal, sustainable way. This means that we need to be sensitive to our natural environment and especially where what is vulnerable needs protected. We also need to be sensitive to those in our society that are vulnerable and, as a Christian community, how we are called to respond to their needs.

With much thought, prayer, and discernment, the Pastoral Council has sent letters to Cardinal Quillet, Prefect for the Congregation of Bishops, Papal Nuncio, Archbishop Pierre, Bishop Mark Brennan, Diocese Wheeling-Charleston, and Bishop Bransfield (via Bishop Brennan and Archbishop Pierre) to address our thoughts, concerns and continued questions related to the recent Congregation of Bishops' decision on the amended plan for Bishop Bransfield.

Disaster Relief Special Collections

Our bishop has approved special collections to support recovery efforts for the explosion in Beirut, Lebanon as well as natural disasters (hurricanes and wildfires) here in the US. Last weekend our collection was for Beirut. Please make checks payable to St. Agnes with "Beirut" in the memo line. This weekend we will collect for the natural disasters. Please also make these checks payable to St. Agnes and write storms/fires in the memo line. We will also be using some funds from our tithing, so whatever is collected will be added to this and checks will be sent to Catholic Charities and Catholic Relief Services. A basket will be available at the church for your donations. You may also mail or drop off your check to the parish office.

Sacraments Course

This five week course (October 18-November 21) will look at the history and theology of the sacraments. Beginning with a look at the Liturgy we will then explore Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation (the sacraments of Initiation). We will then look at the sacraments of healing, that is, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Sacrament of the Sick. Finally, we will examine the sacraments of communion, also known as the Sacrament of Marriage and the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

If you are a catechist or work with the RCIA, couples preparing for marriage, or parents preparing to baptize their children, or are an adult interested in deepening your faith, please join fellow Catholics from across the Diocese as we learn more about our Tradition.

This course is a hybrid model. It is composed of both weekly live two hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF)

This course is being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston who pays 100% of the tuition. The course instructor is Dr. Rodica Stoicoiu

Election 2020

Reminder - although the West Virginia election rules say you have until October 28 to request an absentee ballot, it also says these ballots must be received six days before election day, i.e., October 28. If you choose to vote via absentee, we strongly encourage you to request your ballot soon. They will begin mailing ballots to voters on September 17th. See instructions below on how to request an absentee ballot and how to complete the ballot when it is received.

Voting by Mail – Step 1 - Request an absentee ballot

If you would like to vote via mail, you need to first request an absentee ballot. You can do this in several ways:

Online - You can request on-line that a form be mailed to you by going to your County Clerk or Board of Elections website.

For West Virginia: <https://sos.wv.gov/elections/Pages/GoVoteWV.aspx>.

For Maryland: <https://elections.maryland.gov/voting/absentee.html>.

Call – You can call your County Clerk or Elections office and ask them to mail you the absentee ballot request form. (Jefferson – (304)-728-3215, Berkeley - (304) 264-1927), Washington County, MD – (240) 313-2050

Print your own - You can download the absentee application form from your County Clerk/BOE website. Once you've completed the form, it can be returned via mail, fax, or email to your County Clerk's office.

Pick up and send - You can also obtain a copy of the form from St. Agnes (please call ahead of time) or the Shepherdstown public library, either of whom will fax or scan it and email it for you for free.

Note: You must choose a reason for requesting an absentee ballot. For most of us locally, the reason will be for "medical reasons/Covid". Just being anxious about COVID is a sufficient medical reason to vote absentee. You do not have to be sick with COVID.

Voting by Mail - Step 2 – Completing and returning your ballot

Instructions to complete the ballot:

Marking your Ballot:

Mark your ballot with a pen. Follow the instructions on your ballot, which will tell you to mark your choices clearly with an "X" or fill in the oval with blue or black ink.

The instructions below the title of each office on the ballot will tell you how many people you may choose for that office.

When you finish marking your ballot:

Fold your ballot, place it in the envelope marked No. 1, and seal the envelope. Note: Do not remove the stub from your ballot.

Place the sealed envelope No. 1 (containing your ballot) inside of envelope marked No. 2 and seal envelope No. 2.

Complete and sign envelope No. 2, titled "Voter, complete this form"

Return your ballot to your county clerk's office as soon as possible. You can mail it (be sure you have the correct postage), drop it off at the County Clerks office or have someone at St. Agnes deliver it for you.

What if I make a mistake on my ballot?

If you make a mistake in your selection, cross out both the mark and the candidate or issue, and mark your choice.

If your ballot is destroyed or you cannot correct your mistakes, you should immediately contact your county clerk for instructions on receiving a replacement ballot.

Deadlines for returning your ballot (must be received in the county clerk's office by these deadlines):

By mail: by the close of polls on election day

By mail without postmark: the day after the election

By mail postmarked by the US Postal Service by Election Day: the start of canvass (five days after the election, excluding Sundays)

Hand-delivered (a person may deliver no more than two absentee ballots): the day before the election

Solidarity and Friendship Amid Great Suffering and Turmoil

We are moving into the final week of the “Season of Creation” as we prepare for the feast of St Francis of Assisi. During the latter years of Francis’ life, his words of guidance to his companions were gathered into a short collection, which has become known as *The Admonitions*. Some 800 years later, Pope Francis will travel to Assisi and there, at the tomb of St. Francis, and on the vigil of his feast day, he will sign his own second encyclical. By all accounts, Pope Francis’ inspiration for writing is somehow connected to the sixth guidance/admonition of St Francis to his brothers, which reads in translation as follows:

“Let us all, brothers/sisters, consider the Good Shepherd who to save His sheep bore the suffering of the Cross. The sheep of the Lord followed Him in tribulation and persecution and shame, in hunger and thirst, in infirmity and temptations and in all other ways; and for these things they have received everlasting life from the Lord. Wherefore it is a great shame for us, the servants of God, that, whereas the Saints have practised works, we should expect to receive honor and glory for reading and preaching the same.”

Like his namesake, Pope Francis is in tune with the bro-

kenness of our time and the need to set our sights on our true calling to follow in the footsteps of Christ. We expect the upcoming message to be an urgent and poignant appeal to repair the brokenness all around us: The alliances of the hard won struggles of previous generations are being warped and twisted out of recognition, while at the same time we witness more and more strident efforts to politicize “institutional” religion and “lady justice” herself, by the power of money, smear campaigns, media manipulation, and even the poisoning of opponents. Climate and medical science get pushed aside, even as our bodies, trees and forests are wasting away. The list is long and indeed “a great shame” to God’s pilgrim people. So, let us be on the lookout for Pope Francis’ message next weekend. No text has appeared yet, but it will probably be a form of “admonition” for societal transformation and for ecological healing of our common home. Like Francis of Assisi, who heard the words “Go, repair my house,” to mean literally what they say, Pope Francis is sure to call for urgent action among the followers of Christ and all people of good will, to repair the wounded relationships with our sisters and brothers and the earth which nourishes all living species.
