Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the Fourth Sunday of Advent, I wanted to take a moment to share a little bit about maybe one of the best kept secrets of the Roman Catholic Church. This is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), and the adaptation of this rite for children of a certain age. We hear the story at the end of Advent of the annunciation. The angel says, "hail full of grace," to Mary. During RCIA I often feel as a pastor I get a front row seat to how God's grace works, and it's at work long before they show up at St Agnes' door. The RCIA process starts by asking those that show up how God is present in their lives and, as one listens, they see how the Lord initiates everything. This is very different than telling people what to do or what to believe but, rather, to accompany them on their journey with a listening ear and walking deeper with them into the mystery of God's love. As we celebrate Christmas weekend, may we see everyone who comes to our door as one who God has sent. We should have that attitude every Sunday; whoever is entering the door of our worship space, we should greet them like they have been sent to us by God. Pope Francis means it when he says everyone is welcome into the church because Jesus welcomed everyone. May we see our church this Christmas like Bethlehem where there is always room at the Inn for those who come to seek the Lord. Merry Christmas.

All St Agnes Volunteers... VIRTUS Deadline is Fast Approaching!

All Volunteers must be VIRTUS trained by December 31st! This is required by the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston of all parishes, schools, etc. If you volunteer in any capacity at St Agnes, you must be Virtus trained.

The good news is that the training is all online and can be completed in a short period of time. Our Coordinator, Bill Donahue, can assist with verifying your training status and/or initiating your training. VIRTUS training is designed to help adults recognize the signs that indicate a child or vulnerable adult might be suffering abuse. It also helps adults by offering key points to help children and adults, who might confide in them, deal with potential situations. Finally, it helps adults know who to contact and what the next steps are if they suspect or discover a child or vulnerable adult is being abused. All this training is designed to help adults help others through a difficult situation.

It is truly in the best interests of everyone to have all volunteers VIRTUS trained.

Shepherdstown Shares Current Needs

Shepherdstown Shares exists to respond to any crisis threatening the lives, vitality, and prosperity of the Shepherdstown Community. They serve anyone in the zip code and often beyond.

Our St Agnes food pantry collection the 1st weekend of each month goes to Shepherdstown Shares. Racial Justice Initiative News

America Media, a Jesuit organization that publishes a magazine and provides many online resources for reflection on faith and culture (<https://www.americamagazine.org/about-america-media>), every holiday season presents "Hark!" a podcast on the meaning and the making of our most beloved Christmas carols and their time-honored traditions. Among the songs featured this season is "Go Tell it on the Mountain," a familiar Negro Spiritual.

In this episode, however, the author suggests that the composition of the song may not exclusively derive from the Black southern oral tradition, like most Spirituals. Spirituals first came to wider attention after they were collected by northern abolitionists near the end of the Civil War, but it was John Wesley Work II who became the [first African American collector of Black Spirituals](#) and promoted their wider appeal. Around 1889, Work became the director of the Jubilee Choir of Fisk University. He wanted to teach a new audience of Black Americans the importance of their history and rich spiritual tradition, so he took these classic songs and arranged them as concert pieces. In turn, the wide popularity of the Fisk Jubilee Choir introduced the Spirituals to a broader global audience. "Go Tell it on the Mountain," was one of the few Christmas-themed songs that Work collected and adapted for concert performances. His stanzas, which are based on Luke 2:8-20, have become the standard versions in hymnals around the world. The melody is similar to that of other Civil War songs from which Work and his brother and collaborator, Frederick, may have gotten their inspiration.

As the podcast highlights, the storyline of the Spiritual "is familiar to the Catholic listener. 'Go, Tell It on the Mountain' has a rich theology, centering on evangelism and the proclamation of the Gospel message. It is rooted in the familiar biblical narrative and encourages believers to spread the news of Christ's birth, emphasizing the joyous and transformative nature of the birth of the savior."

Ecclesiology: Pilgrim Church (Begins Week of January 15)

This is the second in a series of courses on the theology of the Church and builds on the course The Beginnings of the Church. We will continue our exploration of the Church and how, as a living organism, it both maintains its continuity with Jesus and reshapes its own self-understanding. We will examine questions of authority, community and governance and look at social and political changes in the Church through the 15th century. This will then aid our conversation as we look at Vatican II and its understanding of the episcopal and papal offices and the models of Church presented by the Council. You will be able to work online taking quizzes and accessing material, as well as meet once a week via Zoom for class lecture and discussion with the course facilitator. The Zoom sessions will be held on Mondays at 7pm for 5 weeks, beginning January 15th.

Introduction to Scripture (Begins Week of January 15)

If you are new to studying the Bible, have questions about reading the Bible, want to learn more about the Bible but don't know where to start; or, if you are working towards your certification for catechesis, this course is for you!! Learn what the Bible is and where it comes from, understand how Roman Catholics read the Bible and what the differences are between a Catholic Bible and a Protestant Bible, start to build your Bible vocabulary by learning about the synoptic Gospels, what is inspiration, and much more. You will be able to work online taking quizzes and accessing material, as well as meet once a week via Zoom for class lecture and discussion with the course facilitator. The Zoom sessions will be held on Wednesdays at 7 pm for 5 weeks beginning January 17th. This course is part of the course sequence for level one catechist certification.

IRA Charitable Gifts

A gift through your IRA is a great way to support St Agnes. Here is some information on how you can maximize your giving in 2023:

IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

- Donors age 70½ or older may make a gift of any amount, up to \$100,000 per individual (\$200,000 for couples with individual IRA accounts), from your IRA without paying income tax on the donated amount.
- For donors who have a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), making a gift directly from your IRA to St. Agnes can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, as long as certain rules are met.
- In addition to the benefits of giving to charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare.
- QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to the recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction, but still use a QCD for charitable giving.
- Funds should be transferred directly from the donor's financial institution to St. Agnes.

EthicsPoint is a third-party reporting system that reports to civil authorities where applicable and Diocesan authorities, and the identity of the person reporting is protected.
